LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

John 8:58 is one of the clearest verses in the New Testament in which Jesus declares his divinity. While he does not say, "I am God," he does use the phrase "I am" in referring to his eternal glory: "Before Abraham was, I am." The Jews who heard him knew exactly what he was saying, because they wanted to kill him immediately after he spoke those words. There was no mistaking his divine claim. The only right response for us, then, is to bow and worship him. Jesus is "God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God" (Nicene Creed). We should not isolate our worship of him to one hour on a Sunday morning but instead devote every moment of our lives to living for his glory.

- 1. For review, read John 8:31-47. What is "the truth" that will set people free? In what sense do we need to be set free?
- 2. Read Galatians 3:7-9 and Hebrews 12:1-2. How do these passages describe the faith of Old Covenant believers? Were they saved in a different way than we are?
- 3. Read Matthew 3:13-17 and Matthew 17:1-13? How was Jesus glorified by the Father in these passages? How was Jesus glorified by the Father in his death, resurrection, and ascension according to Ephesians 1:15-23?
- 4. Read John 11:25-26. What is the context of these verses and how does the context reveal the power that Jesus has over death?
- 5. Read John 8:56-59. What does Jesus mean when he says, "Before Abraham was, I am"? Why did those who heard Jesus say this want to kill him? What did their reaction reveal about their hearts?
- 6. In preparation for next week, read John 9. What do you think is the significance of this healing miracle? Do you notice any irony in the passage?
