LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

In John 15, we encounter another one of Jesus' seven "I am" statements. As we have learned during our study through John's gospel, each of these statements vividly describes Jesus' saving work for his people. The statements are:

```
"I am the bread of life" (John 6:35);
"I am the light of the world" (8:12);
"I am the door" (10:7);
"I am the good shepherd" (10:11);
"I am the resurrection and the life" (11:25);
"I am the way, and the truth, and the life" (14:6); and "I am the true vine" (15:1).
```

The critical word that reveals the importance of Jesus' "I am" statement in John 15 is "true"—Jesus says, "I am the *true* vine." The nation of Israel was planted by God in the Promised Land as his vine, but the nation failed to produce good fruit. Rather than seeking covenant faithfulness and obedience to the Lord (which is the fruit of righteousness), Israel disobeyed the Lord and produced only wild grapes—sin, bloodshed, and idolatry. Jesus, however, was the *true* vine. He was the shoot from the stump of Jesse, who obeyed God with all his heart, soul, mind, and strength. His life was characterized by perfect righteousness. As a result, all those who are united to him, the true vine, are assured that he has accomplished salvation by his obedience, and he gives eternal life to his people.

- 1. For review, read each of the "I am" statements listed above in their contexts and consider what each reveals about Jesus' saving work.
- 2. Read Isaiah 5:1-7. How is God's grace toward Israel described in this passage? What did God expect of Israel? What did Israel produce instead, and what was God's judgment upon the nation?
- 3. What does it mean that the Father "prunes" (John 15:2) the branches that bear fruit? What does this look like in our lives as Christians?
- 4. What does it mean to "abide" (John 15:4) in Christ? How is abiding in Christ revealed in our love for him and our obedience to his commands?
- 5. Do you see the fruit of saving faith in your own life? Why is it important to evaluate your growth in grace as a Christian?
- 6. What are the results of abiding in Christ that you learned in the sermon? Do you see these results in your own life?
