

LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

In today's passage, Jesus, in the context of a command to love one another, makes a surprising statement to his disciples. He says, "No longer do I call you servants,...but I have called you friends" (v. 15). When we consider that God the Son himself is speaking those words to all his disciples it is even more surprising! The only true and living God, the Creator of all things considers us his friends! In this passage Jesus once more teaches us that love is essential for friendship. Just a few verses before our passage Jesus said, "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love" (John 15:9-10). Jesus' love for his disciples moved him to lay down his life for them. This kind of love ought to characterize believers' love for one another.

The second aspect of friendship is seen at the end of v. 15: "...I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you" (John 15:15). Friends share and communicate with each other. In the Scriptures, Jesus opens up and shares with us everything he has heard from his Father. As his friends, Jesus brings us into his confidence, and reveals his plans to us (Eph. 1:8-10). Because we are his friends, we are invited to do the same with him. What a great and wonderful blessing to be friends of God!

- 2. Before this, was anyone else in Scripture called God's friend? If so, who? (See Isa. 41:8 and Ex. 33:11.)
- 3. Does being God's friend make us equals with God? Why or why not?
- 4. What is essential for friendship according to John 15:13? How did Jesus demonstrate his love for us?
- 5. How do we demonstrate our friendship with Jesus (John 15:14)?
