LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

In John 11 we read about the seventh sign that John the Evangelist recorded in his gospel. Each of the signs he recorded were meant to reveal the glory of Christ and the salvation that comes through him alone. John explains toward the end of his gospel why he recorded seven signs in particular as he wrote under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit: "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:30-31).

The life that Jesus gives was vividly displayed in his raising raising Lazarus from the dead. When Jesus effectually called Lazarus to come out of the tomb, Jesus revealed that he is both Lord of our souls as well as our bodies. By his Spirit he gives us spiritual life, and when he returns he will raise our mortal bodies and clothe them with immortality. By raising Lazarus, Jesus was pointing his people forward to his own resurrection on the third day, and he points us today to his return and our resurrection on the Last Day. "Do you believe this?" (John 11:26).

- 1. Read John 11:1-44. What are some details in this story that were not addressed in the sermon yet peak your interest? Why do you think this passage is often preached at Christian funerals?
- 2. When Jesus said to Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life" (John 11:25), he was revealing his divine glory. What examples of Jesus' divine glory do you find throughout the account of the raising of Lazarus from the dead?
- 3. What do you learn about Jesus from his prayer in John 11:41-42? How does what you learn affect your understanding of prayer in your own relationship with the Lord?
- 4. Read Westminster Confession of Faith chapter 32. What happens to the soul of a Christian when he dies? What happens to his body? Why does the Bible emphasize that our bodies will be raised?
- 5. In preparation for next Sunday, read John 11:45 12:8. Why did the religious leaders want to kill Jesus? How does Mary's display of affection contrast with their display of aggression?
