### How Firm a Foundation

How firm a foundation, you saints of the Lord, Is laid for your faith in his excellent Word! What more can he say than to you he has said, To you who for refuge to Jesus have fled?

"Fear not, I am with you, O be not dismayed; For I am your God, and will still give you aid; I'll strengthen you, help you, and cause you to stand, Upheld by my righteous, omnipotent hand.

"When through the deep waters I call you to go, The rivers of sorrow shall not overflow; For I will be with you, your troubles to bless, And sanctify to you your deepest distress.

- **Q. 57.** Which is the fourth commandment?
- A. The fourth commandment is "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy."
- **Q. 58.** What is required in the fourth commandment?
- **A.** The fourth commandment requires the keeping holy to God such set times as he has appointed in his Word; expressly one whole day in seven, to be a holy Sabbath to himself.
- **Q. 59.** Which day of the seven has God appointed to be the weekly Sabbath?
- **A.** From the beginning of the world to the resurrection of Christ, God appointed the seventh day of the week to be the weekly Sabbath; and the first day of the week ever since, to continue to the end of the world, which is the Christian Sabbath.
- **Q. 60.** How is the Sabbath to be sanctified?
- **A.** The Sabbath is to be sanctified by a holy resting all that day, even from such worldly employments and recreations as are lawful on other days; and spending the whole time in the public and private exercises of God's worship, except so much as is to be taken up in the works of necessity and mercy.
- **Q. 61.** What is forbidden in the fourth commandment?
- A. The fourth commandment forbids the omission, or careless performance, of the duties required, and the profaning the day by idleness, or doing that which is in itself sinful, or by unnecessary thoughts, words, or works, about our worldly employments or recreations.
- **Q. 62.** What are the reasons attached to the fourth commandment?
- **A.** The reasons attached to the fourth commandment are, God's allowing us six days of the week for our own employments, his challenging a special propriety in the seventh, his own example, and his blessing the Sabbath day.

## **LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS**

In 2009, TIME magazine named Calvinism one of the "10 ideas changing the world right now." Known for its emphasis on Scripture and the sovereignty of God, some additional distinctive marks of Calvinism (or Reformed theology) are the 5 Sola's and the 5 Points of Calvinism (TULIP), sometimes called the "Doctrines of Grace." The "Golden Chain of Redemption" in Romans 8:28-30 provides an exegetical foundation for this theology, and supplies Christians with the assurance that God's promises are eternal and true. Reflecting on these truths, the late J.I. Packer wrote in his classic book, Knowing God, that "Your faith will not fail while God sustains it; you are not strong enough to fall away while God is resolved to hold you."

- 1. Read Romans 8:28-30. What is the relationship of the Golden Chain of Redemption in vv. 29-30 to the promise in v. 28?
- 2. Name the 5 *Sola's* and the 5 Points, and give a brief definition of each. Describe how each of these Doctrines of Grace is expressly or implicitly taught in Romans 8:29-30.
- 3. Which link in the Golden Chain do you think is the most difficult for people to accept? Why? How would you discuss this with a fellow Christian? How would you discuss it with a non-Christian?
- 4. Read the Westminster Confession of Faith, chapter 18, *Of the Assurance of Grace and Salvation*. Why do so many Christians struggle to find assurance that they are children of God, both now and forever? If you have had doubts about your own assurance, how have you dealt with them? What additional steps could you take to strengthen your faith in this area?
