LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

Exodus 4:27 - 5:18 describes Israel's harsh conditions under slavery. In his dealings with Israel, Pharaoh was the personification of evil. Pharaoh was in league with Satan to oppose God and his promised Messiah (Pharaoh was one of the many kings throughout history who hated God and his Messiah [Psalm 2]). Israel's slavery and how God ultimately delivered them through the blood of the Passover Lamb was a type or a foreshadow of what God would do for his people in the fullness of time through Jesus Christ. We know this because Israel's deliverance from Egypt was later described as a "redemption" in Exodus 6:6, just as the cross is described as a redemption in the New Testament. The Good News of the Gospel is that Christ has set us free from the dominion of Satan and sin. He has brought us into his Kingdom, so that we can now serve him as our Master, Lord, God, and King. Serving Christ is true freedom.

- 1. Read Westminster Confession of Faith 9 (Of Free Will). How does Paragraph 3 describe our slavery to sin? How do you see this demonstrated in this morning's sermon passage and also in the world today?
- 2. Read 1 Corinthians 6:20 and Revelation 5:9. How do these passages describe our redemption through Christ? Compare your answer with Westminster Confession of Faith 9.4. How does faith in Christ grant true freedom?
- 3. How does Jesus describe our service to him in Matthew 11:28-30? How is this completely different than living under the oppression of Satan and sin?
- 4. Reflect on the four blessings noted in the sermon outline under the second point: abundant mercy, Sabbath rest, everlasting joy, and eternal purpose. How have you benefitted from these in your walk with Christ? How might you apply these to your church life as a member of our covenant community here at Grace?



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
