# LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem is a turning point in the gospel because it signals the last few days of Jesus' earthly life. All four evangelists spend a considerable amount of time on Jesus' ministry between his triumphal entry and his resurrection (Matthew 21-28; Mark 11-16; Luke 19-24; John 12-21). This is an indication from the Holy Spirit that the importance of Jesus' life and ministry can best be understood during the final week of his life. It was during this final week that Jesus "gave his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45) and was "raised for our justification" (Romans 4:25).

As we consider Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, we are reminded of Jesus' promise that he will return triumphantly in the Last Day. The difference will be that he will not come peacefully, but he will come to judge those who oppose him and usher in the new heavens and the new earth. We hear this promise at the end of the Book of Revelation as Jesus says, "Surely I am coming soon" (Revelation 22:20). And we as his Church say, "Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!"

- 1. Read 2 Samuel 7:12-17; Isaiah 9:6-7; 11:1-10; and Psalm 110. What kind of Messiah do these passages describe? How does this help you understand the expectations that many first-century Jews had about the Messiah?
- 2. Read Matthew 21:1-7, which describes how Jesus planned his entry into Jerusalem. What does this passage reveal about his intentions? What did he want people to conclude about his identity?
- 3. What are some of the different views about Jesus in our society today? Why do you think there are so many different opinions about Jesus, and what do you think we as Christians should do to help people understand the truth about him?
- 4. What is the significance of what the crowds were shouting as Jesus entered into Jerusalem? Why does John cite Zechariah 9:9?
- 5. What are the practical implications for our lives as we consider Jesus' triumphal entry, especially as we consider the way Jesus was joyfully received into Jerusalem on Sunday and rejected just a few days later on Friday?
