Summary

Romans 8:28 is considered one of the greatest verses in the Bible. The following two verses describe what has been called the golden chain of salvation. The five links on this chain are foreknowledge, predestination, calling, justification, and glorification. This is a description of salvation as a complete work of God.

Discussion Questions

- 1. When Romans 8 says that all things work together for good, what do you associate with the word "all"? Why do you think "all things work together for good"?
- 2. If God is ultimately responsible for our salvation how does this affect human freedom? Does God's sovereignty over your salvation bring comfort and reassurance? If so, how?
- 3. How does knowing God's high call on your life change the way you think about your Christianity? How would your life, your family, your workplace change if you truly took to heart God's purpose and plan to conform you to the image of His Son?
- 4. How do you know if you've been foreknown and predestined by God for salvation?
- 5. Does knowing that your salvation is absolutely secure motivate you towards carnal living or holiness?
