## **Discussion Questions**

- After Absalom kills Amnon, he flees to Geshur where he remains for 3 years.
  During this time, the king (David) does nothing. How does putting off responsibility oftentimes make difficult situations even worse?
- 2. Joab uses the woman from Tekoa to manipulate the king by playing on his sympathies for his son. Is it possible to love our children too much? At what point does it become idolatry?
- 3. How is love, at the expense of righteousness and justice, (and vice versa) more harmful than good?
- 4. God will not sacrifice righteousness for love nor will He sacrifice love for righteousness. How does the Gospel show us that God requires both?
