Anna, a mother of two young children, once lived in a stable home and had a great job. But two years ago, she found herself in a difficult situation, forced to leave her home due to domestic violence. From that point, she faced the challenge of rebuilding her life, finding safe housing, and securing employment.

Four months ago, Anna walked through the doors of Heart for Winter Haven. She attended our New Client Orientation, where she was introduced to the programs we offer and met her Care Manager, Kharla. Since that time, Anna and Kharla have met weekly to create and work through a personalized plan to achieve Anna's goals. One of her primary objectives was to secure stable employment and enroll in our **Faith & Finances** class.

In just a few short weeks, Anna found not one but two part-time jobs. Shortly thereafter, she received a full-time offer with excellent pay and benefits. Her commitment to her goals and consistent effort did not go unnoticed. Our care managers reviewed several clients for the house, and Anna stood out as someone who had been diligent in completing her case plan, attending all her appointments, achieving her employment goals, and successfully completing our 8-week financial literacy program. She even started an emergency savings account.

Thanks to her hard work and dedication, Anna was selected to become the tenant at the house, where we will continue to support her in her journey towards stability. Over the next few years, we will work together to help Anna and her family transition back into the housing market, securing a bright and stable future.

To say that things have moved quickly for Anna since joining Heart for Winter Haven is an understatement. Her story is a testament to what can happen when someone embraces the opportunity for transformation within a supportive community. We are excited to continue partnering with Anna and watch as God reveals her purpose and identity in Him.

It is our prayer that as we move toward our 2030 goals, we will acquire more properties to support families like Anna's, helping them not only survive but flourish. We believe this is just the beginning of what God has in store.



Student Homelessness in Winter Haven

As we concluded the 2023-24 school year, we unfortunately saw the number of students experiencing homelessness in Polk County Public Schools rise to a record-breaking 5,089. In Winter Haven alone, 627 students were affected, representing 12.3% of the overall student

population. Part of this increase is due to the addition of South Pointe Elementary to our area, which contributed to the rise in identified cases. Winter Haven High School, with 100 identified students, has the highest rate of homeless students locally.

Despite the rising numbers countywide, it's encouraging to note that the percentage of homeless students in Winter Haven has remained relatively stable in the 12% range over the past few years, while other cities across Polk have seen

a significant rise in their percentages. This stability is notable given the overall growth in the student population and the increasing number of students facing homelessness. Of the 627 homeless students in Winter Haven, 206 cases are linked to underemployment or unemployment.

This information fortifies our drive to continue offering programs such as **Jobs for Life** and **Faith & Finances** to families in our area. While the addition of South Pointe Elementary has helped us identify more families in need, the numbers remain a challenge. Rest assured, we remain fully committed to addressing this ongoing crisis and continuing our advocacy and work for change within our community.

Also, Dr. Cassie Cook, owner of Bespoke Physical Therapy, recently celebrated her 1 year business anniversary!






As a part of the night, Bespoke PT blessed H4WH with the proceeds from a raffle held at the event!
