Sermon Notes

For Further Reflection:

1. Why is it difficult to be persistent in prayer (vs. 1; 11: 5-9; 21:36; Rom. 12:12; Eph. 6:18; Col. 4:2; 1 Thess. 5:17)? How do you respond when God is not answering prayers the way you want?
2. Why does the widow's situation seem so impossible (vv. 2-3)? How are her actions a model for persistence in prayer for injustice until Christ returns (Rev. 6:9-11)?
3. What is the difference between persistent prayer and badgering God with rote and repetitious prayers (vv. 4-5; 1 Kgs. 18:26-28; 1 Cor. 12:7-9)? How does the contrast between God and the unjust judge give you confidence that the Lord will answer your kingdom centered prayers (vv. 6- 7; 11:8, 11-13; Rom. 8:33; Col. 3:12; Titus 1:1; Eph. 1:4; Isa. 43:1)?
4. How can silence from God actually be a swift answer to prayer (vv. 7-8a; 2 Pet. 3:8-9a; Heb. 10:27)? Why might it be better for God to delay or not answer prayer the way you want Him to answer (1 Cor. 15:10)?
5. What does the delay of Christ's second coming teach you about prayer (vs. 8b; 17: 26-30; Matt. 24:12)? How did Jesus persist in prayer in the face of injustice for you (Matt. 27: 46; Lk. 23:46)?
