Ephesians 6:10-24 (p. 979)

¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. ¹² For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; ¹⁷ and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, ¹⁸ praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, ¹⁹ and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.

²¹ So that you also may know how I am and what I am doing, Tychicus the

beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord will tell you everything. ²² I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know how we are, and that he may encourage your hearts.

²³ Peace be to the brothers, and love with faith, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. ²⁴ Grace be with all who love our Lord Jesus Christ with love incorruptible.

Sermon Notes

For Further Reflection:

1. What first century real life image is Paul deriving his metaphor for the armor of God (vv. 11, 13)? How is this picture more encouraging than the typical depictions of the armor of God that you may have seen in a typical children's Sunday school curriculum?
2. How is Paul's description of daily trials, temptations, and suffering much more complex than you typically think (vs. 12)? What situations or circumstances do you struggle to remember that your battle is not against flesh and blood?
3. What are the resources that God provides for you in spiritual warfare (vv. 14-17; Psa. 51:6; Phil. 3:9; Rom. 5:1; Jn. 14:27; Eph. 2:8-9; 2 Tim. 3:16; Heb. 4:12)? How are each of the pieces of armor reflected in the character and work of Jesus, the Messiah (Isa. 11:5; 59:17; Ps. 18:30, 32)?
4. What role does prayer play in spiritual warfare (vs. 18; Lk. 18:1-8; 21: 36; Rom. 12:12; Col. 4:2; 1 Thess. 5:17; Phil. 4:6)? How does knowing you are in a daily cosmic battle with the world, the flesh, and the devil, highlight your constant need for communion with your Heavenly Father in prayer?
5. What is the relationship between prayer and evangelism (vv. 19-20; Matt. 9:37-38; Acts 4:23-31; Col. 4:3; 2 Thes. 3:1)? How can others pray for the Lord to give you the boldness and words to proclaim the good news of Jesus to your family, friends, neighbors, and coworkers?
