Scripture Reading: Genesis 2:15-24 (p. 2)

¹⁵ The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it. ¹⁶ And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, "You may surely eat of every tree of the garden, ¹⁷ but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."

¹⁸ Then the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper fit for him." ¹⁹ Now out of the ground the Lord God had formed every beast of the field and every bird of the heavens and brought them to the man to see what he would call them. And whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name. ²⁰ The man gave names to all livestock and to the birds of the heavens and to every beast of the field. But for Adam there was not found a helper fit for him. ²¹ So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and while he slept took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. ²² And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. ²³ Then the man said,

“This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man.”²⁴ Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh.

God Speaks To Us

**“A Profound Mystery”
Ephesians 5:22-33 (p. 978, 979)
Barry Noll**

²² Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. ²⁴ Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands.

²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, ²⁶ that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, ²⁷ so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. ²⁸ In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves

himself.²⁹ For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church,³⁰ because we are members of his body.³¹ “Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.”³² This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church.³³ However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

For Further Reflection:

1. What command does Paul give to wives (vs. 22a, 33b)? What motivation(s) does Paul provide for wives to obey this command (vv. 22b-24)?
2. What are some challenges and abuses that come with this command to wives? How does Paul and other New Testament writers address those concerns and abuses (vv. 21, 25; Mk. 10: 35-45; Phil. 2:1-11; Gal. 3:28; 1 Pet. 3:7)?
3. What command does Paul give to husbands (vv. 25a, 28-29, 33a)? What motivation does he give for husbands to obey this command (vv. 25b-27)?
4. How is earthly marriage a reflection of Christ's union with his church and the biblical love story (vv. 31-32; Isa. 62:5)? In what ways can Christian marriage make visible the mystery of the gospel to the watching world?
5. What encouragement can you or those you know who are in a hard marriage or lost their spouse derive from the marriage supper of the Lamb (Matt. 21:29-32; Rev. 19:6-10; Rev. 21:1-5a)? How does the vision of the heavenly marriage empower you to love and serve your spouse especially in difficult times?
