## ***Sermon Notes***

### ***For Further Reflection:***

1. What are the things do you seek to control? How does the Preacher's description of time compound the frustration and vanity of the things you try to control (vv. 1-8)?
2. What is the difference between ownership and stewardship? How does the Preacher's description of the seasons underscore the concept of stewardship rather than ownership when it comes to your time and relationships (Eph. 5:15-17; Col. 4:5-6)?
3. How is God's sense of timing different from yours (vs. 11a; Gen. 1:31; Isa. 58:8-9)? What does it look like to trust in God's timing rather than your own?
4. What frustration has God hardwired into humanity and life under the sun (vs. 11b; 8:17; Job. 5:8-9; Rom. 11:33)? How does the difference between God and man when it comes to time a form of comfort rather than frustration to you (vv. 14-15)?
5. What does the apostle Paul say that God did at the right time (Rom. 5:6; Gal. 4:4-5)? How does this timing lead you to sacrificial service and generosity for those today and future generations to hear the message of the gospel?
