### ***For Further Discussion:***

1. What does Paul indicate are unique differences and challenges for men and women when it comes to worship (vv. 8-9)? Why is purity important when it comes to prayer (vv. 8-10; Ps. 24:3-4; 26:6; 63:4; 1 Pet. 3:7)?
2. What does the inclusion of women in the learning of doctrine say about the uniqueness of Christianity in the first century and today (vs. 11; Lk. 10:38-42)? How is submission actually good for the church and the world (1 Tim. 3: 1-4; Heb. 12:9; James 4:7; Eph. 1:22; 5:21–24; cf; Matt. 26:42; 1 Cor. 15:28; Phil. 2:5-11)?
3. Why does Paul not permit a woman to teach or exercise authority over a man (vv. 12-13; 3:2; 5:17; Gen. 1:27; 2:8; 1 Cor. 11:8-9)? How is Paul's injunction true for most men when it comes to preaching?
4. Why is Paul's description of the woman more an indictment of Adam than Eve (vs. 14; Gen. 3: 6, 13; Rom. 5:12-21)? How does this underscore the need for the exercise of godly headship in the home and in the church?
5. In what sense are not only women but men are saved through Eve's offspring (vs. 15a; Gen. 3:15; Isa. 7:14; Mic. 5:3; Matt. 1:23, 25; Lk. 1:34-35; Gal. 4:4)? How are the characteristics of faith that Paul enumerates evidence of salvation rather than the merit for salvation (vs. 15b; Eph. 2:8-10)?
