<sup>1</sup> That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. <sup>2</sup> And great crowds gathered about him, so that he got into a boat and sat down. And the whole crowd stood on the beach. <sup>3</sup> And he told them many things in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow. <sup>4</sup> And as he sowed, some seeds fell along the path, and the birds came and devoured them. <sup>5</sup> Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and immediately they sprang up, since they had no depth of soil, <sup>6</sup> but when the sun rose they were scorched. # For Further Discussions

1. Why did Jesus speak in parables (vs. 10-17; Isa. 6:9-10)? How is the Parable of the Sower foundational for understanding all other parables (Mar. 4:13)?

2. What is the seed that is being sown among the soil of people's hearts (vv. 4-5, 7-8, 19; Isa. 55:10-11)? How does cynicism or religiosity cultivate a hard heart toward Christ today (vv. 4; 19)?

3. How does the seed sown among the rocky ground demonstrate belief without conviction (vv. 5-6, 20-21)? Why do we tempted to believe that faith in Christ makes us immune to suffering?

4. How does western culture foster a belief that is choked by the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches (vv. 7, 22; 1 Jn. 2:15-17)? In what ways do you see your faith being choked by daily concerns of life, wealth, and the pursuit of pleasure (Matt. 6:19-34)?

5. How do you have an open heart to receive the gospel (vv. 8, 22; 11-12, 16-17; Ezek. 36:25-27; Lk. 18:26-27)? Where do you see the gospel bearing fruit in your marriage, family, relationships, and work?
