## God Speaks To Us

"The Unstoppable and Unfathomable Kingdom"
Matthew 13:24-33, 36-43 (p. 818, 819)

<sup>24</sup> He put another parable before them, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field, <sup>25</sup> but while his men were sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat and went away. <sup>26</sup> So when the plants came up and bore grain, then

the weeds appeared also. <sup>27</sup> And the servants of the master of the house came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? How then does it have weeds?' <sup>28</sup> He said to them, 'An enemy has done this.' So the servants said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' <sup>29</sup> But he said, 'No, lest in gathering the weeds you root up the wheat along with them. <sup>30</sup> Let both grow together until the harvest, and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, "Gather the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.""

<sup>31</sup> He put another parable before them, saying, "The kingdom of heaven is like a grain of mustard seed that a man took and sowed in his field. <sup>32</sup> It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is larger than all the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches."

<sup>33</sup> He told them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven that a woman took and hid in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened."

<sup>36</sup> Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples came to him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." <sup>37</sup> He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man. <sup>38</sup> The field is the world, and the good seed is the sons of the kingdom. The weeds are the sons of the evil one, <sup>39</sup> and the enemy who sowed them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. <sup>40</sup> Just as the weeds are gathered and burned with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. <sup>41</sup> The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will gather out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all law-breakers, <sup>42</sup> and throw them into the fiery furnace. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. <sup>43</sup> Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. He who has ears, let him hear.

#### For Further Discussions

- 1. Why do you think that Jesus told parables about the growth of the kingdom of heaven? How might they encourage his early disciples and followers of Jesus today?
- 2. How does the ministry of Jesus and the apostles demonstrate that the kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed (vv. 31-32; lsa. 6:13; 11:1-10; lsa. 53:2-3; 1 Cor. 1:17; 1 Cor. 2:1-5)? In what way is the growth of the mustard seed a picture of rest and the gathering of people from every tongue, tribe, and nation who find their rest in Jesus (vs. 32; Ezek. 17:22-23; Ezek. 31:1-14; Dan. 4:11-12; 21)?
- 3. What is the difference between the power of leaven and the growth of a mustard seed in terms of their relationship to the kingdom of heaven (vv.31-33; cf. Gen. 18:6; 1 Cor. 5:6-8; Gal.5:9)? How does taking these two parables together encourage you to persevere in building the kingdom of heaven when there may not be much visible spiritual fruit?
- 4. Why does Jesus refer to himself as the "Son of Man" (vv. 37, 41; Dan. 7:13-14)? What assurance does that designation imply about the reign and rule of Christ over the kingdom?
- 5. How does Jesus in the Parable of the Weeds distinguish between those who belong to the kingdom (vv. 38-38, 43; Isa. 45:24-25; Dan. 12:2-3) and those who belong to the evil one (vv. 38-42; 2 Thess. 2:1-12; Matt. 18:6; 2 Thess. 1:7-9)? What encouragement is Jesus providing the church by saying the master allowed both weeds and the wheat to grow together until the harvest (vv. 29-30,37-38; Isa. 30:18; Ezek. 18:23, 32; 33:11; 2 Pet. 3:9)?
