"Jokes" are not allowed and anyone doing them will be sent home. Cell phones, ipads, video games, or other electronics are not permitted.



TUESDAY QUIET TIME

Run With Endurance (The Race is Long)

Good morning! Are you ready for "The Most Amazing Race?" No, I'm not talking about our challenges for today. I'm talking about the race of life we run as Christians. Just like in a marathon, this race requires us to be dedicated, focused, and determined. I Timothy 4:II-I6 gives us some great advice on how to run this race well, and guess what? This race isn't just for adults. Get your Bible out and read I Timothy 4:II-I6.

One of the first things it says is, "Let no one despise your youth." In other words, just because you are young, does not mean you cannot make an impact on the world and on others. The passage goes on to say that you should be an example.

1 Timothy 4:12: "Let no one despise your youth; instead, you should be an example to the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity."

Paul tells Timothy to set an example in several areas. Let's break these down and see how we can apply them to our lives.

Keep Your Eyes on Jesus (The World Wants You to Conform)

Good morning! Today, we're going to talk about what it means to be proud of something really important—our faith in Jesus. Sometimes, it might feel scary to talk about our faith, but God encourages us to be bold and unashamed. Let's see what the Bible says in Romans 1:16-17.

Romans 1:16: "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is God's power for salvation to everyone who believes, first to the Jew, and also to the Greek."

What is the Gospel?

The gospel is the good news about Jesus—that He died for our sins and rose again so we can have eternal life with God.

Imagine you have the best news ever, like your favorite team winning the championship, and you can't wait to tell everyone. The gospel is even better news! Actually, it's the very best news!

Why is the gospel such good news for everyone?	



Let's see what Romans I:16 says: "...because it is God's power for salvation to everyone who believes..."

What is Salvation?

Salvation means being saved from our sins and having a relationship with God forever.

Think about being rescued from danger by a superhero. Well, Jesus is our hero! He doesn't come flying in with a cape, though. What He does for us is even bigger. He saves us from sin and gives us eternal life.

What Does it Mean to Live by Faith?

Living by faith means trusting God every day and believing in His promises.

Persist to the End (The Prize is Waiting)

Good morning and congratulations! You have made it to the last day of The Most Amazing Race! Have you run in a race or played a really tough game? If you have, you know it takes a lot of effort, practice, and determination to finish strong. The Bible talks about our faith like it's a race we run. In 2 Timothy 4:7, the Apostle Paul says, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith."

Paul is telling us that living for Jesus is like running a race or fighting a battle. It's not always easy, and sometimes it can be really hard, but it's worth it. He's saying that he did his best, he didn't give up, and he stayed true to his faith in Jesus.



Trust in Jesus: Just like a coach helps an athlete, Jesus guides us and gives us strength. When we trust Him, we know we're never running alone.

the Bible: The Bible is like our training manual. It helps us know how to live and stay strong in our faith.

Pray: Talking to God helps us stay connected to Him. We can ask for help, strength, and encouragement when things get tough.

Encourage Each Other: Just like teammates cheer each other on, we can support and encourage our friends in their faith too.

Remember, it's not about being perfect. It's about trying our best and trusting God to help us every step of the way.
