**Discussion Questions** - These are a conversation starter and guide, not a script.

1. What does God mean when He said to Moses, “**I am who I am**” (v. 14)? What does it mean that God is self-existent and self-sufficient?

2. How might we slip into thinking that God somehow needs us? Why is it good news that God does not need us?

3. How did the burning bush that was not consumed communicate God’s self-existence? Can you think of other instances in Scripture when God came to creation or even dwelled *in* creation, and yet the creation was not consumed?

4. How can we, like the bush, light up our lives with God’s light which never goes out? In what ways do we go to other finite, temporary sources of light to light up our lives that will go out?

5. What do we mean when we say that someone has “burned out”? How does the burning bush that did not burn out give us the cure to burning out?
