1. What lie do the nations and their leaders believe in v. 3? What is their view of God's authority over them? What kind of freedom are these people looking for?
2. What is God's response to the wicked in v. 4? Why might it be dangerous for us to laugh at and mock the wicked, while it is appropriate and right for God to do so See also Jude 9.
3. Why is it so significant that God's King is His Son vv. 6-7? See Colossians 1:13. What does the Father want to give His Son in v. 8? How does this gift give us a hint that something will change in the nations that were raging in v. 1?
4. What does David call the kings of the earth to do in vv. 10-12? In these verses, how do we see that life, freedom, and joy only come by submitting our lives to Jesus Christ?
5. In v. 12 what does it mean to take refuge in Jesus? How does taking refuge in Him cure us of our raging and restlessness in v. 1?
