Grade 2 Update from Mrs. McGrail

Winter greetings- as they say "You can't get too much winter in the winter!" I hope you all have been well. It has been quite the term for our class and for others throughout the school who have been affected by illness. We have been busy in Term 3 gearing up for all things Medieval! Here's the latest happenings:

Bible- Away from the Old (Testament that is,) and into the New Testament! Most second graders seem to have a firm mastery of all the Old Testament books in order. With that, we are now working to memorize the New Testament books! We are thoroughly enjoying the New Testament jingle. In Term 3 we are also learning about the Parables of Jesus. We are utilizing the Adam Raccoon book series which is geared towards children to have a visual and easier understanding of Jesus' parables. Later in the term we will also learn about the Armor of God (along with a special poster project!)



Math- We are now in Unit IO! This unit replicates Unit 9 but with hundreds subtraction instead of addition. This unit is generally far more challenging for students as subtracting doesn't come as easily since it often requires a deeper understanding of number relationships and the concept of "taking away." All the reminders to practice those math facts really shows in this unit.

FUNdations - Unit 9- We are now learning the remaining three r-controlled sound combinations.

History-This is likely the most popular term of the year = Medieval times. Kids just love all the stories and history of castles, kings, queens, knights, etc. ! We just learned about the Feudal System - ask your child about it so they can share their knowledge of Middle Age history.

Science - We will focus on the basics of simple machines (pulleys, wheels, etc.).
