Dear friends, Hey ya'll, we can't wait to see ya'll at the banquet! WHAT? You are not coming? Why (pronounced Whah)?

clear up a few things. The banquet is free and designed NOT to be a burden to parents who are already financially stretched. The point is to invite people who do have more discretionary funds as your guest (grandparents are the best!). It is an incredibly fun evening and great exposure to the school. It also helps fund many programs and extras that benefit all our students.

This year At HCA we updated the flooring in a wing of the school, purchased 40 iPads that are shared by all the K-8 students, and are continuing to expand the Nature Explore Playground. We also awarded over \$65,000 in financial aid to 25% of our precious families. We plan to award even more financial aid next year and hope to redo the gym floor in a rubberized material!

If we just knew some stupid rich people and they gave us all we needed, all our dreams would come true, right? Well, at times God does choose to do amazing things through smart, spirit-filled people



Classroom Happenings



Team C ~ Grades 5 & 6

Hello again families and friends. Time is flying! Can you believe we are already in May? Team C is just now beginning to enjoy the spring weather we are having. Some of us were lucky enough to get a taste of it as we explored our nation's capital and history a few weeks ago. Since then we have been learning about the Oregon Trail and Westward expansion in history class, along with some people who were referenced as the 49ers....ask your kids who they were. We will have our chapter 13 history test next Wednesday so studying has begun. In language arts, students have become excited as they have chosen books for an upcoming book report. Now this is not your typical book report. It is entitled "Book Report in a ." Students choose some sort of container such as a paper bag, cereal box or other creative container. They then decorate the outside of their box with pictures and words that represent the story. Inside there are more interesting ways to convey the story to their classmates. I will be sending home more detailed and creative instructions soon, but keep reading Team C! Mr. Curtis

It is finally spring in New England! There seems to be a collective sigh as we experience and enjoy the grass, warmth, and sunshine on a regular basis now. Our gardens will be waking up too as we add compost, seeds, and plants in the next 2 weeks.

In preparation for our planting time, students are learning about soil, including how it is made and how to determine the type of soil it is. This week's lab had students analyzing three soil samples to determine whether each one would be classified as sand, silt, or clay. We made some key observations about particle size and texture, but then timed the drainage ability of the samples to confirm our observations. The quiz on soil will be on Monday, May 11th.

In math, both team C classes have been working with percentages and their relationship to decimals, ratios, proportions, and fractions. This chapter is full of real world math that they have been surprised to find applicable to their real lives. Your students may be able to figure out tips, tax, and discounted prices now!

In Spanish, we are reviewing all we have learned this year in 8th grade, to have a strong finish and a solid foundation for high school Spanish. In 7th grade, we are enjoying some fun ways of learning with children's books. This Friday, May 8th, join us, from 1:00 to 2:35, for our Cinco de Mayo celebration in the gym.
