Principal's Corner

Dear Friends.

If you were at chapel on Monday, you probably sensed my excitement over the memory verses.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. 9 An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. Luke 2:8-9

Every Christmas I try to imagine the story with fresh eyes, perhaps from different perspectives: the shepherds', the angels', neighbors', the sheep, etc. I ask God to show me something I haven't noticed before. This year what jumped out to me was THE FIELDS! Why? Because in January my husband and I are going on an Archaeological study tour of the Holy Land and will actually see the fields of Bethlehem! We are getting very excited.

When our kids were small my Mom did a lot of traveling and she always said it was great but she wished we could have been with her. Now I know just how she felt because I wish my family and the entire HCA family could come as well!

According to educational research, the most effective instructional strategies are as follows:

- 1. Being there
- 2. Immersion
- 3 Hands on
- 4. Second hand –books, videos, lectures

There is no substitute for being there, using all your senses and making your own memories! That is why we take so many fieldtrips. Immersion is number two and that is what we try to do when we focus an entire term on topics and

integrate them into every subject. Our big days are the celebration and perfect expression of this immersion.

Hands on leaning is effective as well, so all those models, recipes, experiments and experiences we try to provide have tremendous value and are well worth the time. Second hand learning can be effective especially when multiple modalities are involved like visual, auditory, kinesthetic and the learning is a part of a larger learning experience.

So why the educational talk? Because I want our students to get the most out of our trip! I want the Holy Land to come to life for them so that they can visualize the Bible as they read it and know that the people, places and stories therein are real! They happened to real people who lived in a real place. Our culture is drenched in fabricated realities. Even reality TV is staged. The worlds of video games, Narnia, Middle Earth and even Santa on the North Pole are very real to children. Fact and fantasy are all scrambled in the heads of younger kids and even some adults I know!

Seeing their principal and history teacher in a real place will make a difference in their thinking process. My prayer is that it will bring the Bible to life for them and change their thinking patterns for the rest of their lives. Although somewhat technologically challenged, we plan to make daily uncut, unedited (be forewarned!) video snippets of every place we visit. We will try to post them every evening so our students can follow our trip as it happens. I told the kids we would be playing, Where's Wilber ?(Gary's real first name!) and they can check in and track our trip. Attached, please find a calendar of the tour and we'll let you know how to watch the videos as soon as we figure it out! The classes will all read the Bible references that are included and we are asking for questions we can answer in shout outs on the videos. (Parents can submit questions as well.) We are trying to make this trip an immersion experience for all!

Please pray for us as we plan, practice the technology, and travel. We want to make the most of this opportunity for HCA and our church. We are blessed beyond measure to be able to walk where Jesus, Abraham, and Moses walked and look forward to sharing it all with you and your precious children!



The Gift of Chocolate

In the month of December it has been our tradition to collect money for buying chocolate for orphans in Belarus. HCA has a long-standing relationship with a mission to orphans in Belarus through our friends and coworkers in the Kingdom, Olga & Yasha Goncharenko. Olga started Spring of Revival Ministry many years ago as a single woman. Today they serve hundreds of orphans in several different orphanages.



The traditional Christmas present for Belarussian children is a box of chocolates. For the orphans it is a special treat and if Olga doesn't provide it then the kids will get no gift! Every year we raise funds so Olga can purchase the chocolates.

We pray you might give generously and provide the funds for at least one child (\$5.00). All money for chocolate should be sent to the office by December 12. Please make checks payable to HCA.

ANYHOW Program Returns to HCA!

We are bringing the program back due to popular demand; families requested we bring it back especially for the Christmas season of gift-giving. Buy shopping cards through HCA, and a percentage of the price of the card is credited to us from the retailers participating in this program. You can buy shopping cards to stores you shop at already, including grocery, gas, clothing, online and entertainment. Seventy-five percent of each credit will be credited to the family's tuition account, or the family may choose to have their credit applied to another family's account, HCA's financial aid fund, or next year's tuition. Twenty five percent of each credit will be retained by HCA for administrative and fundraising costs, including shipping. What's the catch? You just have to plan ahead!

- * Visit www.ShopWithScrip.com and use enrollment code <u>AD779DF213848</u>
- * Sign up for PRESTOPAY, a direct debit from your checking account; this is the easiest and most efficient form of payment. Alternatively you can send in a personal check or checks, made payable to HCA, once you've placed your online order.
- * Order online* and pay online, or send payment to the office for the full face value of the cards.
- * Send your enrollment form to the office, along with payment if you haven't already paid online.
- * Your FACTS payments will be adjusted to reflect your credits each month. If you have paid in full, you will receive credit toward next year's tuition.

*In order to streamline the program this year we prefer that all orders are placed online. If you do not have online access you may send in a retailer list (available in the school office) as an order form; be sure to highlight the cards you would like, and include your name on the form.

Can other people order?

- * Anyone can order through you; just include their order and payments with yours, then you will be responsible for distributing the cards when they come in.
- * Any staff member or community member who places an order will have their credits made to the HCA Financial Aid fund.

Necessary Details...

- * Payments for Anyhow orders are not tax-deductible because participants receive dollar for dollar value.
- * Anyone writing a nonsufficient funds (NSF) check will incur a fee equal to the fee charged by HCA's bank.
- * The vendors & percentages are subject to change due to holiday and seasonal special promotions as well as changes dictated by the vendor.
- * In no way does Holden Christian Academy or the ANYHOW program endorse the participating stores. You must make your own decision whether to purchase from each store.
- * Each store has their own policy on change back from certificates. Find out before paying for your purchase.

Classroom Happenings



Team C ~Grades 5 & 6

My colleagues warned me that term two was fast and challenging. They were right! So far we have visited Boston, studied how the early settlers of America became colonists, and examined the growth of colonial America and the changing relationships in our heritage that led us to the costly war for independence. And the best is yet to come: We will soon be studying the Declaration of Independence and Constitution. This will be our first close study of primary sources—actual documents from the historical period as opposed to books written in our own time about the period. Reading 18th century documents is very challenging, so please do not be surprised if we move much more slowly over the remainder of the term. This is a skill that is both important and rewarding as we guide students toward thinking critically and independently about our heritage.

As our historical studies get deeper and more demanding, I have tried to counterbalance with lighter material in language arts class. Our main focus this term is creative writing. We have workshopped setting design and are now turning to a study of characters. Our reading book, The Printer's Apprentice, serves as a good example of both. We will continue to use the book as we work our way toward plot design at the end of the term.

Over the next week please look for lots of additional information from Mrs. Cleveland and me. We are in the process of planning our Team C Christmas party and will be in touch soon with requests for healthy snacks and treats. Also, the students have elected to do a book exchange at the party—timed nicely with next week's Scholastic Book Fair. Finally, please note that next Wednesday marks the midpoint of term two. You will receive an e-mail with a link to your student's progress report just as you did in term one.

As always, it is a great privilege to be in partnership with the Team C families. Let us continue to lift one another in prayer, especially in this blessed season of advent.

Team D~Grades 7 & 8

We are working diligently on Roanoke essays in both 7th & 8th grades. 7th grade is focused on writing a theme-based essay, while 8th grade has honed in on very specific individual topics. Grammar will come alive as we add edit our essays in the next week. Additionally, we are tackling one of two units on poetry this year. This first one guides us gently into a focus on the birth of our Savior.

During Devotions and LA, coupled with Scripture, we are reading poems from A Widening Light: Poems of the Incarnation by Luci Shaw. The students are becoming so skilled at noting the craftiness of the poets. I love watching this stage of discovery and development in their minds.

In Spanish, my encouragement is to study, study, and study. The basics are necessary. Five minutes a day in review will go a long way. Enough said!

This term goes particularly fast given the breaks and days off. I have shared with the students the importance of staying on top of what we are doing after days off and breaks. The days we are in school will be packed full!

8th Grade Science is exploring the amazing details of the periodic table. Next week we will begin to prepare for a two day long lab where students will use tests and observations to compare the properties of some unknown metals and make predictions using their knowledge of the periodic table.

7th Grade Science is focused on Fishes, Amphibians and Reptiles until the end of next week. We will have a chapter 3 test next Friday, December 12th. Students will complete a virtual dissection online over the weekend for homework. We will do a few "real" dissections in the Spring!

Exciting New Addition to our FFL program ~ We are now the proud owners of a Tower Garden®. This is a state-of-the-art vertical aeroponic growing system. We are in the process of setting it up to grow green leafy veggies with grow lights through the winter. More to come....

Math ~ We will be taking Benchmark Tests in all Math classes this week and/or next. Benchmark tests do not count toward a student's grade. They are a way for us to measure how well the student is grasping and applying taught skills. Students will only be tested on skills that have been presented in class. Progress is tracked on a form that helps highlight strengths and weaknesses. These are a valuable tool for me and for the students.
