STUDY AND APPLY

- 1. Read Acts 7:23-29 (a portion of Stephen's speech). How does this account add to your understanding of the Exodus account?
- 2. What purpose do these two scenes from 2:11-22 in the life of Moses serve? How do they look back to what has already occurred and prepare us for what is to come?
- 3. What do you learn about Moses' character, thoughts, feelings, and heart at this stage of his life? If you were to describe a portrait of what kind of person he was from this passage, how would you describe him?
- 4. Read Hebrews 11:24-27. What more do we learn here about Moses? Why is this significant?
- 5. Moses' first attempt to deliver one of his own people from oppression ends in complete failure and he flees from Egypt to Midian and remains there for forty years. This was a time of enduring God's discipline and as Hebrews 11 describes, the reproach of Christ. Describe a time when God used a failure to teach and mature you. What did you learn about yourself? About God?
- 6. Looking back at the beginning and the ongoing experience of your Christian life, how have you found yourself identifying as a "sojourner in a foreign land"?
- 7. What insight from 2:11-22 seems most personally significant to you in your life right now?
