A Word about Morale

The departure of our founding pastor due to a moral failure was a difficult moment in our church's history, and some members, including elders, chose to leave in its wake. Due to this, our financial reality is no longer that of a two pastor church. Our Assistant pastor has done a great job in a role he wasn't brought on for, but is seeking a call elsewhere.

Yet we believe God is far from done with Holy Cross. Those who have remained continue to stay committed to the Lord and to one another. Our love for God, His Word and our community remains steadfast, and has carried us through a difficult year in our church's story. Flourish's Executive Director, Matt Bohling, has spent significant time with us and offers this insight into the faithful community at Holy Cross:

Small Group Involvement. We have a strong participation and commitment to meeting weekly in Life Groups. Life groups serve as a primary place of fellowship for the congregation.



Pulpit Ministry. We continue to receive preaching that connects with a broad audience, including those who don't know Christ yet and those who are not from "our circles." Many of our people have not previously attended a PCA church.



Attendee Participation. As a small church community, we depend on volunteers to support our Sunday morning kids' rooms and worship, and other church-sponsored events. Our members and regular attendees consistently demonstrate their commitment by generously giving their time and resources.



Assimilation of New Members. The Lord has continued to bring people our way and, by His grace, our community eagerly welcomes new people into the life of the church and invites them to get involved.

AREAS OF GROWTH & FUTURE PLANNING

There are aspects of life at Holy Cross that come with more complexity and challenges. At the same time, we have areas where we are actively growing and working to strengthen our foundation. With the Lord's help, we can navigate these together, relying on His grace and trusting Him to work in and through us.

May the God who Heals grant that we will continue to seek Him, even as He helps us continue to grow in grace.



Multi-Generational Ministry.

While HC welcomes attendees of all ages, our community leans toward young families. We view this as a strength and an opportunity for growth as we seek additional resources to develop a more structured children's ministry.



Leadership **Development.**

We currently have five Ruling Elders and four deacons overseeing the leadership and care of our church body. We are continuing to prayerfully ask the Lord to raise up a next layer of leaders to move the church forward.



Ongoing Need for Shepherding.

Our community has walked through a difficult season of transition due to moral failure by the founding pastor, and we are ready to welcome a committed individual who can embrace and lead our church forward.

Our Beliefs

The perfect record and righteousness of Christ, not the increase of our character, is the basis of our hope and salvation. When it comes to our beliefs, we don't expect that everyone will agree with us, but we do hold certain theological convictions that influence our ministry practices and expressions.

Please refer to our <u>website</u> for helpful summaries of our doctrine. As a congregation of the Presbyterian Church in America, we hold to the Westminster Standards. You can visit <u>www.pcanet.org</u> to explore the beliefs of our denomination. Having a connectional form of church government, we are one of the 17 churches that form the PCA's <u>Arizona Presbytery</u>.

Our Core Values

We arrived at the following **seven items** through a survey assessment of a healthy crosssection of our people. We think this accurately reflects the most important aspects of the life of our church.

1. Fellowship

At Holy Cross, relationships are vibrant and essential. We genuinely enjoy being together, fostering a true sense of community rather than just a social gathering. We believe biblical fellowship happens when Christians share their lives and engage with one another through God's Word.



2. Worship

Attributing worth to God is also at the core of what we do and who we are as believers at HC. Our covenant-keeping LORD is indeed "worthy to be praised" (Psalm 18:3/2 Samuel 22:4) and we are firmly committed to gathering publicly to surrender our lives to Him and extol His virtues because He is our God, our Savior, and our King.



3. Bible Knowledge

We want all of our people to have familiarity with the truths of the Scriptures and provide multiple opportunities for our community to study and reflect God's word (Sunday teaching, small groups, Bible studies, etc.). We believe this is key to having our minds renewed (Romans 12:1-2) so that our lives become more and more reflective of the Lord Jesus.



4. Church Membership

As God has entered into a covenant with His people, we reciprocate by pledging our lives in solidarity to Him. In a world where even the Church can be laissez-faire about commitment, we solemnly vow to follow Christ together. This is somewhat rare for churches in the western United States and reflects our love for Him and for one another.



5. Encourage

We know fellowship isn't just small talk and socializing. Instead, our healthy involvement in each other's lives is meant to spur us on in the faith. It's not simply about our common interests—but as a necessary component of Christian living, as per the exhortation of Hebrews 3:13, "But encourage one another every day, as long as it is still called 'today,' so that none of you will be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin."



6. Gospelcentered living

We at Holy *Cross* believe that the gospel sits as the "hub" for life and ministry. Our relationship with Christ is central to our lives and thus every aspect of life is organized around His Person and Work.



7. Preaching & Teaching Scripture

At Holy Cross, we deeply cherish the Bible—it is the foundation of our faith and the guiding truth in all we do. While it may not be listed first, that's only because it is understood as the cornerstone of our community.



Our Aspirations

The two final values below were not expressed through the survey instrument we utilized to ascertain the seven above. Nevertheless, we maintain that these are things that we want to be true of our life together so that we can be a growing and vital church. As such, this grouping expresses our aspirations as a congregation.



We are aware that we need to do a better job of community ministry and engagement.
We want to unite our strength with gospel words to muchneeded gospel demonstration through our deeds. Christ said that through His earthly life and ministry the poor have the gospel preached to them (Luke 7:22). We want to share our Lord's heart for the poor and disenfranchised and reach out to lost people whose only hope is Christ, whether they know it or not.





Demographics and Description

Marana and Oro Valley, towns in the greater Tucson area, offer a perfect blend of suburban comfort and natural beauty, making them ideal for families and professionals. Marana, where Holy Cross has made its home, is a growing community with affordable housing, strong schools, and a vibrant outdoor scene. Oro Valley, an affluent suburb of Tucson, is known for its stunning mountain views and ample recreational opportunities, offering a peaceful and family-friendly environment. Both areas provide easy access to downtown Tucson's amenities while maintaining a tranquil atmosphere.

Residents enjoy a high quality of life with easy access to major travel hubs like Phoenix Sky Harbor (PHX) and Tucson International Airport (TUS). The city offers a wide range of attractions from the Sonoran Desert Museum and Sabino Canyon to year-round college sports at the **University of Arizona** (Go Wildcats!). Phoenix, just two hours northwest, features major attractions like the NBA's Suns, MLB's Arizona **Diamondbacks**, and the NFL's Arizona Cardinals. For a quick weekend getaway, Tucson is just three hours from Sedona and Flagstaff, and four hours from the White Mountains. And for those seeking the ultimate Arizona experience, the Grand Canyon is only five hours away.

PART 3: Our Lead Pastor Profile

What Our People Are Saying

The Holy Cross congregation was invited to provide feedback regarding needed traits in our next pastor by completing an assessment tool provided by *Flourish Coaching*. We received completed surveys from a broad swath of our people, 31 individuals in all. Using the **Head**, **Heart**, and **Hand** rubric, here's a summary of what they told us they believe Holy Cross *NEEDS* in our next pastor. Ephesians 1:12b states that the first believers were chosen "to *be* to the praise of His glory," so we'll start with that, accordingly.

HEART (To Be)

A candidate will be *mature and emotionally secure*. We can't emphasize this enough. Being rooted in their identity in Christ is an absolute essential. Failure on this point causes people to look to sources other than the Lord to find satisfaction. We want our pastor to be deeply in love with Jesus. The biblical qualifications of a leader found in 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1 only include one particular ability: to be able to teach God's Word. The rest of the qualifications speak to the character and integrity of the elder. This is paramount to us at Holy Cross.

HEAD (To Know)

We love our church and are aware that we are a young congregation that trends heavily toward young families with children. We want to acquire wisdom and grow in our exercise of our spiritual giftedness. Thus, our pastor will need to know how to *help people develop their leadership abilities*. We in no way expect our pastors to do all the work. Instead, we want you to be a willing delegator so that we can partner with you in ministry. He'll need to understand how to *formulate strategy and implement vision* as well.

HAND (To Do)

In terms of practical ministry, the chief task for our next pastor is to *encourage people to relate their faith to their daily lives*. One respondent remarked that, "Our church has always been good at encouraging those who attend to make Jesus part of every aspect of their lives." As we live Christ-centered lives, our love for Him will never be confined to Sunday mornings alone but will permeate every aspect of our lives at home, on the job, and together. We need guidance to apply God's Word to everyday life situations. This will, at times, necessitate that you help us to *deal effectively with conflict*. Wherever you have people, you have the need to work through things together in order to stay in fellowship with each other. We want your help with this too.





What Our Coach is Saying

As you know, *Flourish Coaching* is working with us as we move toward calling our next pastor. Flourish's Executive Director, Matt Bohling, has distilled the following traits that he sees as necessary:

- Accessible preacher who can preach to unbelievers and non-Presbyterians in profitable ways
- Proven, experienced disciple who is also a discipler/developer of people who
 can create a discipleship pathway at Holy Cross
- Developed competency in leading a Life Group as well as in developing new Life Group leaders
- **Either has worked through personal trauma** AND/OR is trained and thus "trauma-informed." This will be important to help people to work through their trauma and grief.
- Experienced leader who can rebuild the Session and lead the Staff
- Personally missional and focused on encouraging the engagement of unbelievers by congregants

What Our Coach is Saying continued


Flourish's Executive Director, Matt Bohling, has distilled the following traits that he sees as necessary:

- A leader in Outreach unto Evangelism
- A leader who can build the sub-structures Holy Cross needs to maintain a growth trajectory (see: The Trellis and the Vine).

Summary: Holy Cross is seeking a biblically grounded, emotionally mature leader who can lead with humility and confidence, helping the church heal, grow, and fulfill its mission to make disciples both locally and globally.

Expectations of Our Next Pastor

- Preach 45-47 Sundays per year
- He will also be active in Arizona Presbytery and attend the General Assembly annually as regularly as possible.
- He is ordained or is ordain-able in the PCA.
- Preferred Experience:
 - Ten years of total ministry experience (including but not limited to internships, youth ministry, parachurch, etc.) and three years of ordained ministry experience, which includes preaching.



Compensation

Holy Cross will offer a total package (i.e. salary, housing allowance, and benefits including retirement, life insurance, and disability) of \$100,000 - \$135,000 (based on experience and need) to our new pastor.

- Cash Package: \$100,000 split between Salary & Housing Allowance, as pastor desires
- 403b Retirement: \$7,000 Employer Contribution
- Health Insurance: Estimated value of \$28,000

This represents a total estimated package of \$135,000. Holy Cross is able to cover \$100,000 of the package, between reserves and internal giving. The pastor will be asked to create the other \$35,000 annually in a manner of their choosing. Holy Cross is open to our new pastor being bi/co-vocational, engaging in fund-raising, and/or a dual income household.

The terms of call include four weeks of paid annual vacation and one week of study leave. Additionally, Holy Cross is willing to assist with relocation expenses.
