

Unit 5 • Session 5 GOD DESERVES OUR WORSHIP Leviticus 1–4

WHAT IS WORSHIP? WORSHIP IS CELEBRATING THE GREATNESS OF GOD.

God gave laws to show His people what holy living looks like. God gave His people rules about how to live, how to worship, and what to do when they sinned.

God met with Moses at the tabernacle. God told Moses, "Speak to the Israelites and tell them what to do when they bring an offering to Me." Different types of offerings were needed at different times.

Priests made the sacrifices that God commanded. God gave them rules about how to offer sacrifices.

When people wanted to praise God, they gave burnt offerings. God deserves our praise. The Israelites praised God for bringing them out of Egypt.

When people wanted to thank God, they gave grain offerings. God deserves our thanks. The Israelites thanked God for providing everything they needed.

When people wanted to celebrate God, they gave fellowship offerings. God deserves to be celebrated. The Israelites celebrated God for dwelling with them, and they honored Him as their King.

When people wanted to say they were sorry for sin, they gave a sin offering. God is honored when people turn away from their sin and turn back to Him. The Israelites needed to make their relationship with God right again. The priest gave an offering so the people could be forgiven.

Christ Connection: God deserves our worship. He created us to be in a relationship with Him, and He has provided salvation from sin through His Son, Jesus. We can worship God by loving and obeying Him as we live to give Him glory.
