INTRO ...Introduction to "Nothros"

"Earnestness" = spoudé, — 'haste,' takes on such meanings as 'work,' 'effort,' 'zeal,' 'seriousness,' 'readiness,' 'dedication.' ... spoudé has for Josephus the meaning 'concern,' 'attentiveness,' 'liking,' also 'involvement,' 'desire']

"Sluggish" = nothros; i.e. lazy, dull, slothful] "That you might not be sluggish"

Ezekiel 34:11-13 The Lord GOD Will Seek Them Out

- "For thus says the Lord GOD: Behold, I, I myself will search for my sheep and will seek them out. ¹² As a shepherd seeks out his flock when he is among his sheep that have been scattered, so will I seek out my sheep, and I will rescue them from all places where they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. ¹³ And I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land. ...Moving from Sluggishness to Earnestness features 3 things in this passage— (1) Informing Our Patience, (2) Strengthening Our Faith, (3) Relocating Our Hope

(1) "Informing Our PATIENCE"

...It is quite likely (As Modern Americans) that our expectations about "doing life" are more informed by Making Hershey's Chocolate Milk ...than by Making Fine Wine! ...We can be expecting that Spirituality is a combination of my decision & instantaneous experiences!

"ENDURANCE" ... we started Hebrews by pondering Heb 12 as a focal point—

Heb 10:36 For you have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God you may receive what is promised.

Heb 12:1-2 ...let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ² looking to Jesus...

"The church is a people of the future, a kingdom-come community that is always learning anew how to wait." **James K.A. Smith,** "How to Inhabit Time", p. 19

... You Will Live in Perpetual Conflict with Life—If You Have Erased the Concept of ENDURANCE from Your Life's Pursuits!

v. 12 ... "imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises" ... v. 15 "Abraham, having patiently waited, obtained the promise" — Abraham waits 25 years before he sees the promise fulfilled! ... God could have shortened that!

... Endurance is NOT OPTIONAL

Jeremiah Lived in a Particular Time/Moment

Lamentations 3:16-18

- ¹⁶ He has made my teeth grind on gravel, and made me cower in ashes;
- ¹⁷ my soul is bereft of peace; I have forgotten what happiness is;
- ¹⁸ so I say, "My endurance has perished; so has my hope from the LORD."

NOTICE!! ... When You Run Out of Endurance in This Life—You Run Out of HOPE!!

Endurance is akin to the "Fermentation Process"—It is Necessary for Faith to Be What God has Ordained it to be!! ...There is Something VITAL going on during the "Endurance Process"

- Rom 5:1-5 Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. ² Through him we have also obtained access by <u>faith</u> into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in <u>hope</u> of the glory of God. ³ Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces <u>endurance</u>, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces <u>hope</u>, ⁵ and <u>hope</u> does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.
- 1 Peter 1:3-9 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to <u>a living hope</u> through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴ to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, <u>kept in heaven for you</u>, ⁵ who by God's power are being guarded through <u>faith</u> for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. ⁶ In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, ⁷ so that the tested genuineness of your <u>faith</u>—more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ. ⁸ Though you have not seen him, you love him. Though you do not now see him, you believe in him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, ⁹ obtaining the outcome of your <u>faith</u>, the salvation of your souls.

? — What do I do with such a concept if I'm a Teenager or in my 20's or 30's? ... What Do I Do if I'm "Spiritually IMPATIENT!"?

— We are being "guarded by faith"—a Faith That Must Remain Vibrant & Strong All the Way to the End! (the Doctrine of the Perseverance of the Saints) ...Thus God has Placed "Workout-Stations" along the Path of Our Journey—to Keep Faith Alive & Vibrant!! ...These "Workout-Stations" are "NECESSARY"—and they feel like various trials that test & grieve us!
