The rest of the Book of Psalms

Summary: The book of Psalms is a collection of 150 ancient Hebrew praise songs that were compiled by numerous writers over hundreds of years

Ps 42:13 Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting! Amen and Amen.

Ps 72:18-20 Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, who alone does wondrous things. Blessed be his glorious name forever; may the whole earth be filled with his glory! Amen and Amen! The prayers of David, the son of Jesse, are ended.

Ps 89:52 Blessed be the Lord forever! Amen and Amen.

Ps 106:48 Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting! And let all the people say, "Amen!" Praise the Lord!

The final doxology of book 5 many commentators say goes from chapters **146-150** and serves as the conclusion for the whole of the Psalter.

Ps 150:1-6 Praise the Lord! Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens! Praise him for his mighty deeds; praise him according to his excellent greatness! Praise him with trumpet sound; praise him with lute and harp! Praise him with tambourine and dance; praise him with strings and pipe! Praise him with sounding cymbals; praise him with loud clashing cymbals! Let everything that has breath praise the Lord! Praise the Lord!

There are ...

- 3 main categories of Psalms Illustration looking at the heaven and seeing the stars
 - Hymns/Praise the heart's rejoicing of God's character
 - Ps 29, 111, 149
 - Laments the heart's cry due to life circumstances
 - Ps 3, 10, 13, 22, 41, 44, 79
 - Thanksgiving the heart's rejoicing at God's actions
 - Ps 30, 75, 118

Applying the Psalms

- How would the original author have sung this Psalm to God?
- O What does the rest of the Bible say about this Psalm?
- o How would Jesus have sung this Psalm to God?
- O How would the Holy Spirit sing this Psalm to you?
- O How will I sing this Psalm to God?

These ways of thinking through the Psalms are followed by these application questions:

- O What am I to believe?
- o What am I to feel?
- O What am I to do?
