# What is Reformed Theology?

Definition: Reformed theology is a <u>God-centered</u> framework rooted in the authority of Scripture that exalts the sovereign grace of God in salvation, humbles the sinner, magnifies Christ, and fuels a life of worship, holiness, and mission.

"Reformed theology is nothing less than biblical Christianity". – R.C. Sproul, What is Reformed Theology?, p. 21

# What is Calvinism? (TULIP)

T – Total Depravity – we aren't just broken, we're dead in sin (66% of evangelicals think people=good)
Romans 3:10-12, Ephesians 2:1-3

"We are not sinners because we sin. We sin because we are sinners.". – R.C. Sproul, Chosen by God?, p. 117

U – Unconditional Election - God chooses whom He will save based on His grace/mercy not our merit. Ephesians 1:4-5, Romans 9:11-16

L – Limited Atonement (Definite Redemption) – Jesus died to save His people/sheep, not just make salvation possible.

Matthew 1:21, John 10:14-15

I – Irresistible Grace – God's grace doesn't crush the will, it transforms it John 6:44, Acts 16:14

P – Perseverance of the Saints – True believers will endure in faith to the end.

Philippians 1:6, John 6:37

### Common Objections & Biblical Responses?

- Objection #1 "That's not Fair or God is Cruel"
  - a. Reformed response: God gives mercy to some and justice to others--but never injustice.
  - b. Scripture: Romans 9:14-18, 2 Peter 3:9, John 3:16

"The issue is not why God doesn't save everyone. The issue is why He saves anyone at all." – R.C. Sproul, Chosen by God, p.53

"God's design is to magnify His mercy and justice." – J. Edwards, End for Which God created the World, p.122

- Objection #2 "Why evangelize or pray if God already chose?"
  - a. Reformed response: God ordains the end—and the means (60% of teens say...)
  - b. Scripture: Acts 13:48, Romans 10:14, James 5:16, Philippians 4:6-7
- Objection #3 "So...you can do whatever you want & not lose salvation"
  - a. Reformed response: True believers endure-not because of their strength, but God's
  - b. Scripture: Romans 6:1-2, John 10:27-29, 1 John 2:19, James 2:17
- Objection #4 "God chose based on foreseen faith"
  - a. Reformed response: Foreknew means Foreloved. Election causes faith—not reverse
  - b. Scripture: Romans 8:29, John 10:25
- Objection #5 "We're just robots then"
  - a. Reformed response: God works through our willing choices.
  - b. Scripture: Philippians 2:12-13, Acts 2:23

"Grace does not destroy the will but sweetly and powerfully draws it." – John Owen, The Holy Spirit, p.308

- Objection #6 "What about my friend or family member?"
  - a. Reformed response: We grieve loved ones, but our grief doesn't override God's Justice
  - b. Scripture: Romans 9:20

"Your grief may be the very tool God uses to save them." – Bruce Ware, God's Greater Glory, p.126

#### Why this Matters?

- 1) It gives you assurance John 10:28 you're not holding onto God, He's holding unto you
- 2) It humbles you 1 Corinthians 1:29 no boasting
- 3) It fuels mission Romans 1:16 we preach boldly because God saves
- 4) It gives strength in suffering Romans 8:28 even your pain is in Gods hands
- 5) It calls you to holiness Ephesians 2:10 saved for good works
- 6) It leads to deeper worship Ephesians 1:6 to the praise of his Glorious grace
