## ***Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,***

The people of Goshen are deeply grateful for your partnership in the Gospel. We trust this update finds you and your family doing well. Below are some recent updates on the work at Goshen Reformed Church in Ghana.

### **Teaching & Preaching**

In the past month, we continued our series on our beliefs. We covered different themes such as church leadership, salvation, ordinances, marriage, and the end times.

We studied Acts 6:1–7 and 1 Timothy 3:1–12, where we saw the two offices of the church, namely elders and deacons. These are qualified men chosen by a congregation to serve. The elders are tasked with shepherding and overseeing God's flock, whilst the deacons serve in other ways that free the elders to devote themselves to prayer and the ministry of the Word.

We then continued with salvation and its display through the ordinances. In summary, we are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone, for the glory of God alone. All of this is based on the gospel as revealed in Scripture alone. The gospel is that we were dead in our sins, but Jesus came into this world, lived a perfect life, took upon Himself our sin, and died in our place on the cross, receiving the punishment we deserve. Everyone who repents and believes this message will not perish but will have everlasting life. This message is displayed to us through the two ordinances: baptism and the Lord's Supper. In baptism, we demonstrate how we died and rose again with Christ. In the Lord's Supper, we remember and celebrate Jesus, who shed His blood for our salvation. I encouraged the church to make good use of these means of grace.

We then moved on to marriage. From the account in Genesis, we learnt that God instituted marriage as a covenant between one man and one woman for the purpose of exercising dominion and multiplying to fill the earth. We do not define what marriage is; God alone does. I then showed the church that marriage displays the covenant relationship between Christ the Bridegroom and the church, His Bride. Husbands and wives are therefore to live according to Ephesians 5:22–33, reflecting this relationship as faithfully as they can to the glory of God.

Just this past Sunday, we learnt about the end times, when Jesus will come again and every person will be resurrected for judgement. Those who live in rejection of Christ will enter into everlasting torment, whilst those who repent and believe in Jesus will enjoy everlasting life with Him in heaven.

### **Campus Ministry & Evangelism**

Campus outreach ministry resumed past week and we had two of the students joining us for service this Sunday. I will be reaching out to these students every Tuesday and Thursday during this semester and will desire your prayers; that the gospel will bear fruit in their hearts and that the Holy Spirit will grant repentance and faith to many.
