Prayer of Confession

Leader: God of everlasting love, we confess that we have been unfaithful to our covenant with you and with one another.

People: We have worshiped other gods: money, power, greed, and convenience. We have served our own self-interest instead of serving you and others.

Leader: We have not loved our neighbor as you have commanded, nor have we rightly loved ourselves.

People: Forgive us, gracious God, and bring us back into the fullness of our covenant with you and one another. Through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Assurance of God's Pardon

Leader: The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in lovingkindness.

People: He has not dealt with us according to our sins, nor rewarded us according to our iniquities.

Leader: For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his lovingkindness toward those who fear him.

People: As far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us.

God's Will for Our Lives

Leader: Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.

People: Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will. (Romans 12:1-2)
