Greeting

*Call to Worship (Psalm 100)

Leader: Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness!

People: We come before him with joyful songs!

Leader: Know that the Lord is God! It is he who made us, and we are his!

People: We are his people, the sheep of his pasture!

Leader: Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise!

People: We will give thanks to him and praise his name! For the Lord is good and his love endures

forever! His faithfulness continues through all generations!

Leader: Amen! Let us worship God!

Prayer of Confession of Sin (unison)

Prayers of the People

A leader may introduce the theme of each part of the prayer, and then others may pray aloud in keeping with that theme.

Praise: "Gracious and almighty God, we begin by praising you for who you are and what you have done."

Anyone may pray aloud. Consider praising God for his creative power, his care, his plans and purposes; praise Jesus for his saving work; praise the Spirit for dwelling in us and working through us. Etc.

Prayer for the World: "Dear Lord, because you are so good and have done such wonderful things, we ask for your help."

Anyone may pray aloud. Pray for peace, for global health, etc.

Prayer for our Church: "Dear Jesus, be with our congregation in these times, even though we are scattered apart. Help us to have a deep sense of unity in your love and mission."

Anyone may pray aloud. Pray for needs and concerns in our congregation.

Prayer for our personal growth in grace: "Holy Spirit, we know that it is your desire to set us apart completely for our Savior's purposes. We ask you to work in our hearts and lives."

Anyone may pray aloud. Pray for the Spirit to sanctify us in God's truth. Include prayers that we can apply what we learned from Scripture and the sermon to our lives.

Silent prayer: "Lord God, we now take a moment for silent prayer, to lift up to you all the burdens of our hearts."

The Lord's Prayer: "And now, Lord God, we follow the Master of prayer, our Lord Jesus Christ, in praying the prayer which he taught us, saying:"
