employing these days to slow down the spread of COVID-19 is

Social Distancing

What's curious is that there was an Old Testament prophet that was commanded to be tucked away in complete isolation. Think of it as the forerunner to **Social Distancing**

Setting the stage

God sent the prophet Elijah with a word of judgment to the palace to proclaim that it would not rain for three and a half years. Here's how God phrased it in 1 Kings 17:2 Now Elijah the Tishbite, from Tishbe in Gilead, said to Ahab, "As the Lord, the God of Israel, lives, whom I serve, there will be neither dew nor rain in the next few years except at my word.

The next step -

The next step after issuing the gutsy decree of "no rain" is hiding. It is not an unusual thing for those that God calls to go into isolation. Then the word of the Lord came to Elijah: "Leave here, turn eastward and hide in the Kerith Ravine, east of the Jordan. 1 Kings 17:3

What Gods hiding accomplishes

You will drink from the brook, and I have directed the ravens to supply you with food there." So he did what the Lord had told him. He went to the Kerith Ravine, east of the Jordan, and stayed there. The ravens brought him bread and meat in the morning and bread and meat in the evening, and he drank from the brook. 1 Kings 17:4-6



Its in the out-of-the way places where spiritual formation happens

[before you can stand at Carmel you must sit at the brook]



It's the out-of-the way places that show us Gods provision

[Before you can bless a widow at Zarephath, you must receive God's provision at the brook]



Its the out-of-the way places where God teaches us how to follow

Some time later the brook dried up because there had been no rain in the land. Then the word of the Lord came to him: "Go at once to Zarephath in the region of Sidon and stay there. I have directed a widow there to supply you with food." [Before you can show others the way, your brook must dry up]

Let's catch the end of the story: (Elijah at Mt. Carmel)



1 Kings 18



- · Elijah challenges Ahab and his 850 prophets to meet him at Mt. Carmel.
- · Elijah rebukes Israel for wavering between worshiping the Lord and Baal.
- · Elijah proposes a contest between himself and the prophets of Baal.
- · Each side is to prepare a young bull as a sacrifice and place it on an altar.
- · The Baal prophets cry out but there is no response.
- · Elijah prays. Fire falls from heaven and consumes the sacrifice.
- The people cry out, "The Lord, He is God!"
- · Elijah tells the people to kill the prophets of Baal.
- · Elijah announces the end of the drought.
