### SET YOUR PAST ON FIRE TKINGS 19:19-21

> <sup>19</sup> So Elijah went from there and found Elisha son of Shaphat. He was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen, and he himself was driving the twelfth pair. Elijah went up to him and threw his cloak around him. 20 Elisha then left his oxen and ran after Elijah. "Let me kiss my father and mother goodbye," he said, "and then I will come with you." "Go back," Elijah replied. "What have I done to you?" 21 So Elisha left him and went back. He took his yoke of oxen and slaughtered them. He burned the plowing equipment to cook the meat and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he set out to follow Elijah and became his servant. 1 Kings 19:19-21

# GOD'S CALL

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God had told Elijah that He would raise up another prophet after him. God tells him to find Elisha. The prophet Elijah

finds Elisha plowing in a field with a team of oxen. He goes to him and throws his cloak around him.

- · Elisha is a wealthy man.
- · Elijah lays his mantle on Elisha—a sign of vocation or calling.
- · Elisha understands the gesture. God is calling him to raise him up as a prophet.
- · Elisha has a choice—to remain a farmer following the furrows or follow the prophet to an unknown future.

000 · He owns a farm in Abel Meholah (the breadbasket of Israel). · He has twelve teams of oxen. He drives one team. His servants drive the others.

## ELISHA Sets Mis PAST

Elisha took the plows and the oxen and built an altar. He set everything on fire that was no longer his to keep. He did this not to create a future of his own making but to enable him to receive the future that God was creating for him.

- Elisha refused to take his past into his future.
- · That's why he slaughtered his oxen.
- · That's why he burned his plow.
- He did it in public. He threw himself a going-away party and invited everyone he knew.

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## 3 IMPORTANT Legsons From The STORY 000

ALTARS are a PLACE where GOD MEETS US

Elisha signals a big "yes" to God and Elisha with his altar-building. He was making a profound statement: "There is no turning back for me—I have made my choice!"

ALTARS are a PLACE of COVENANT

Elisha makes a lifetime decision. He will make himself available to God. He takes the call and the covenant seriously. He pledges his life to God with eyes wide open.

ALTARS are a PLACE of COMMITMENT

This wealthy young man became a servant to Elijah the prophet for eighteen years. Elisha committed himself to serving Elisha however and wherever he was needed. That experience readied him to serve as the next prophet.
