ST. BARNABAS, APOSTLE

We first meet St. Barnabas in Acts 4—and there we also learn that "Barnabas" was a nickname given him by the original apostles (his birth name was Joseph).

"Barnabas" translates to "son of encouragement." And from early on, the apostle lived up to his name. He sold property and donated the proceeds to the apostles for the sake of the gospel (Acts 4:36-37). The next time we see Barnabas, he boldly vouches for the newly converted Saul when the rest of the apostles are skeptical of the former Pharisee's faith (9:26-27). But his ministry of encouragement doesn't end there; when Barnabas visits the church in Antioch, he rejoices in God's grace and encourages the new Christians to remain faithful to the Lord Jesus (11:22-24).

Barnabas eventually accompanied Saul (later Paul) on his missionary endeavors. But when Paul refused to take along Barnabas's nephew Mark, the two apostles experienced a sharp disagreement (15:36-41). This disagreement God ultimately used for his glory, because the gospel was now advancing on two fronts, and eventually Barnabas and Paul (and Mark) were reconciled.

Barnabas's gift for encouragement was a gift he offered to the church at large for the glory of God. According to tradition, Barnabas died a martyr's death; he was stoned in Salamis for preaching the gospel of Christ.

May the witness of St. Barnabas, both in his life and in his death, encourage us all to remain faithful to the Lord with all our heart!
