THE SEASON OF PENTECOST

School is out. Schedules modulate to include more vacations. Summer—marked more popularly by Memorial Day than by June 21—is here. In general, things seem like they slow down, even if it's just a little bit.

To some extent, it feels this way for the church, too. Holy Week, Easter, and the Ascension seem long gone. The feasts of Pentecost and Holy Trinity are, for now, recent memories. The festival season, adorned with red and white and processions and nearly weekly Eucharistic celebration, comes to an abrupt end.

White and red give way to green. A long season of green. The season of Pentecost.

But if Pentecost's color is red and Holy Trinity's color is white, why is the season of Pentecost green? Because the holy church, born on Pentecost by the Holy Spirit (red), now enters into a time of instruction and growth. The chief teaching of the church, marked by the color white, is the doctrine of God as Triune, or three-in-one. Having been baptized and saved by this God, we grow as we listen to the teachings of Jesus from the gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. We today experience the refrain that described the church in the book of Acts: "And the Word of the Lord increased."

So as schools recess for the summer, the church continues to gather in the spirit of Pentecost. We learn and grow and increase in knowledge and grace and faith. And we follow our Lord on this steady green march toward the end of the church year. And there, when Pentecost gives way to Advent, we will see once more how the life of the church is woven seamlessly into the life of Jesus Christ her Lord.

TODAY'S GUEST SPEAKER PASTOR JAIME KRIGER - LUTHERAN RADIO UK

Pastor Jamie Kriger joins us today to share information about Lutheran Radio UK (LRUK), a global mission started in 2012. LRUK is the internet radio station of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of England, a confessional Lutheran church and sister/partner church of the LCMS. LRUK broadcasts worldwide with 24/7 Christ-centered programming, grounded in the Bible, and featuring a variety of formats.

King of Kings members, Renée and Dale Lutzen, are hosting Pastor Kriger for the weekend and are involved in helping spread the news and support this ministry in the United States. Renée's sister, Denise Seaman, also hosts a regular radio show each Thursday on LRUK, Songs of Hope, a weekly reflection on Psalms.



Tune in to LRUK at anytime and anywhere in the world using a computer, iPad, tablet or Smart speaker. LRUK Christ-centered programming has an outreach that spans almost 3000 cities in over 136 countries, including 34 countries that are either Muslim states or where East Asian religions are predominant. Listen live or play podcasts that interest you. Featured programs include:

- Daily Offices, devotion, Bible studies and sermons
- · Bible readings and reflections
- The Lutheran Confessions in everyday language
- Documentaries and talk-shows examining pressing issues for the Church today and providing straight answers to debated questions
- Traditional and contemporary Christian music

CHANGES TO LIVESTREAM

Do you watch our livestream on your TV through the Vimeo app? If so, please be aware that beginning June 27, Vimeo will no longer support the TV app on your smart-TV or smart-TV device, including Roku, Apple TV, Chromecast, Android TV or Amazon FireStick. Instead, the provider wants users to **screencast** the livestream from your mobile device to your TV for a better ongoing experience. Here's how:

- 1. Connect your device to the same WiFi as your TV
- 2. On your device, go to the livestream online found on our website and available through the Sunday weekly email
- 3. Click in the lower right corner of the video
- 4. Select the name of the TV to cast on to
