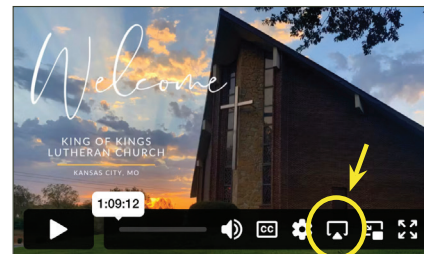
CHANGES TO LIVESTREAM

EFFECTIVE JUNE 27

Do you watch our livestream on your smart-TV through the Vimeo app? If so, please be aware Vimeo will no longer support the TV app on your smart-TV or smart-TV device, including Roku, Apple TV, Chromecast, Android TV or Amazon FireStick.

Instead, the provider wants users to **screencast** the livestream from your mobile device to your TV for a better ongoing experience. Here's how:

1. Connect your device to the same WiFi as your TV
2. On your device, go to the livestream found on our website or available through the Sunday weekly email
3. Click on icon  in the lower right corner of video
4. Select the name of the TV to cast on to



If you need help testing this prior to a Sunday morning, please contact Amy Babcock at 816-885-7777; or a member of our Stream Team: Keith Robinson, Ryan Howerton, Bill Popa or Clint Austin.

This change ONLY affects viewers that watch livestream on a smart-TV through the Vimeo app. All other ways of viewing remain the same.
