Questions for Family Discussion or Personal Reflection

- In what ways do we see and experience God's kingdom right now? What tempts us to forget about the kingdom?
- In what ways are we still awaiting the *restoration* of God's kingdom? What do you most look forward to in the kingdom of God?
- For Parents:** Take this opportunity to share the gospel with your kids. Perhaps begin by asking them how they think a person becomes a member of Jesus' kingdom. Then after listening to their response, explain that Jesus is the loving King who came to rescue his people from their sins. He asks us to put our trust in him and his finished work on the cross in order to be saved from the punishment our sin deserves. He took our place; suffered so that we don't have to. When we put our faith in Jesus, we also accept him as the King of our lives. Ask your children if this is something they would like to do. **For Children or Teens Who've Already Expressed Faith:** Discuss what it means for Jesus to be your King.
