Message from Brother M.R.

As I begin to write this message I find myself challenged by the reality that another year has passed. It seems as if we were just moving in a few days ago, but 10 months have passed since we first came to preach the revival. I can't help but ask where the time has gone. With the passing of one year comes the promise and

opportunity of a new year in which we can learn from our past and set goals for what can be in the future. The reality that a year passes quickly gives us the incentive to get serious as life really is short. As I think of setting goals and laying out the plans to see those things actually happen, I am reminded of Paul as he wrote to the Philippians sharing his dreams. "But one thing I do: forgetting what is behind and straining forward for what is ahead, I press on" (Phil.3:13) Paul was a goal setter with a plan to make those dreams come true, and God honored that request. Not only did Paul have a dream, but he had a clear plan to make that dream come true. He knew where he wanted to be when he arrived at his goal. He also knew just what he had to do to get there. Next he knew that the first step was the hardest to take and there was no time like the present to get started. I once read a question that I have asked myself often. If not us then who? If not now then when? The lesson we can all learn from Paul was that you can never stroll to a goal. If you have your sights set on a goal your already well on your way. Now good aim is critical, but not if you never plan to actually shoot for it. In Paul's example we see that he not only had a dream but a clear and well thought out plan of how to get there. Now we read in Timothy 4:7&8 that he did arrive at his goal, he did finish the race so we know from that truth that he actually gave it a shot. To finish the race he had to get started.

The new year is filled with promise because God is going to go there with us! That reality alone is reason for great hope. Now God is the same yesterday, today and forever. He honored Paul's request and He has promised to help us as well. In light of this great truth I hope each of us has taken time to dream of where our lives will lead us this year. Perhaps the best way to find the answer to that question is to ask ourselves another honest question. If I ended up at my goal by the end of this new year where would I be exactly? For those who have tried their hand at shooting it goes without saying that focus is very important. It requires careful aim to hit what your shooting at in the distance. That's why we need to have clear objectives that guide our planning. That's why we need to set goals that have a way to be measured along the way. The slightest variance in direction from the beginning causes the shot to miss badly if it travels any distance. The year will pass quickly but the distance traveled in that time will be great. The enemy will be there trying to deflect us from our course in hopes of spoiling our dreams. Day by day we need to be reminded of our goals and how to stay or get back on track if we have stumbled. 365 days are a lot of opportunities, and not every day will see us closer to those goals. However, as those days turn into weeks, and those weeks become months, as we keep straining for what is ahead we will make progress if we don't give up.

So now is the time to dare to dream a God sized dream. Now is the time to get that dream started. Now is the time to take careful aim and lay out a plan to never give up that dream until we are standing in it's presence. If not today, then when?
