

Youth & Younger Single Adults

We are fast approaching Thanksgiving & Christmas, and it is at this time of year that we are reminded of those less fortunate. So, the youth & singles plan two service projects to meet the needs of the less fortunate in our community. First, from now through November 24th we will be collecting food staples and toiletry items to put together in a basket and give to the homeless. Of course the homeless have no ability to fix for themselves a traditional Thanksgiving meal, so we will provide food staples that can meet their physical hunger during the week leading up to Thanksgiving. Many of the homeless go to one of the ministries that offer a meal on Thanksgiving, but that's only one meal, and we would like for them to have something to take with them. As you can imagine hygiene is always an issue with the homeless, and they are desperate for items that help them feel clean. We have made hygiene kits in the past and they are like passing out gold, there are never enough, and someone always goes without. Items we plan to collect are as follows: wash cloths, soap, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrush, canned meat, crackers, cookies, small bibles, etc. You may have noticed there are homeless donation bins placed at the welcome desk in the main sanctuary foyer as well as the downstairs elevator lobby, all donated items should be placed in those bins. We will then make these Thanksgiving baskets and get them in the hands of the homeless in time for Thanksgiving. If you would like to make a donation in lieu of shopping for specific items then you can sponsor an entire basket for \$15.

The second project will be our yearly Valley Rescue Toy Drive. This year we have placed two large bins in the downstairs elevator lobby (marked Valley Rescue) for the purpose of collecting new toys to give to the needy this Christmas from **now through December 13th**. When you do your Christmas shopping please grab an extra gift to brighten the day of a child this Christmas and then place it (unwrapped) in one of the bins. Gifts will be separated whether for boy/girl and age range as follows: **infant/toddler ages 0-3 years, ages 4-7 years, and ages 8-12 years old**. Please keep in mind that each year there is a larger need for the 0-3 year old bracket and the 8-12 year old bracket. Our students and singles will be volunteering twice in December, once on **Sunday afternoon the 1**st from **2:00-4:30pm** to separate toys by age, and then we will pass out toys to needy families on **Saturday, December 14**th from **8:30am-2:00pm**. Please join us in these two service projects and share the blessings God has stored with you by giving to others. May God richly bless you as you bless others.

Lakewood is also the Chattahoochee Valley Collection Center for 8 drop-off locations in our area including LaGrange, Eufaula, Auburn, Buena Vista, Roanoke, Valley, Ellerslie and Columbus. Volunteers are needed for Collection Week that begins on November 18 and ends November 25. Contact Linda Keown if you are able to help receive shoeboxes from our community and carton them for trucking to the Atlanta Processing Center. This is a wonderful

ministry to be involved in. Everyone is welcome!
