A message from Dr. Jerry Horner

On the last day of April, I will begin my eighty-first year on this earth, which is the Oriental way of saying that it's my eightieth birthday. All my life I have been advancing my definition of old age.

When I was a youth, sixty was old, but with the passing years, my view of old kept moving farther away. In my teens, eighty seemed to be light years away, located at the edge of the grave. Looking back, I find that the years between childhood and now have flashed by at the speed of light. I guess it's because once you're over the hill you pick up speed. I can well identify with an inscription on a clock case at Chester Cathedral in England: "When as a child I laughed and wept, time crept. When as a youth I dreamed and talked, time walked. When I became a full-grown man, time ran. When older still I daily grew, time flew. Soon I shall find in traveling on, time is gone."

I suppose I first became aware of the reality that I might be getting old when I discovered that the snap, crackle, pop I was hearing every morning was not my breakfast cereal. There were other clues as well. I'll never forget the feeling that came over me when a young stranger addressed me as "Pops." Then there is the fact that I had to explain certain things to my grandchildren, such as "dialing a number," or "the life of Riley," or "Kilroy was here." Young ladies would rush to pick up something I had dropped, while I was still trying to decide whether to try to bend over or squat. When waitresses began to call me "Sweetie," or "Darling," or "Hon," I was vain enough to think it was my natural charm, until it hit me that it was my natural age. I recall that when I was a child, I regarded nap time as punishment; now, it's like a

brief vacation.

I really don't mind birthdays, because they're good for you. Statistics show that the people who have the most birthdays live the longest. I've never understood why some people get upset when they reach a certain age, whether it be forty or fifty or whatever. Why should anyone complain about growing older? Think of all the people who don't have that privilege. I have discovered that even though you can't help getting older, you don't have to get old. Being eighty is not particularly a great achievement, and it requires little effort. Anybody who lives long enough can do it. But age is more than a matter of chronology; it's also a matter of attitude and disposition. How well you live is a greater measurement of life than how long you live. Fifteen hundred years ago, a wise man wrote these words: "Yesterday is but a dream, and tomorrow is only a vision, but today well lived makes every yesterday a dream of happiness and every tomorrow a vision of hope."

One of my favorite biblical heroes was an octogenarian named Caleb. He was at a stage when most people are ready for the front-porch rocking chair, saying, "I've had my day. Let the young people take over, while I reminisce about the good old days." But Caleb was of a different spirit (Numbers 14:24). He was not satisfied with a pension and easy retirement. He was not content to write memoirs; he wanted to win mountains. He was not among those who see a difficulty

in every opportunity. He saw an opportunity in every difficulty. Instead of asking for strength to match the mountain, he asked for a mountain to match his strength.

I admit that old age is a temptation to settle for molehills, but there isn't much challenge in molehills. The best cure for senility and hardening of the arteries is to ask God for a mountain. The secret of Caleb's attitude is found in Joshua 14:8, where he announced his decision that he would wholly follow the Lord. The word "wholly" means completely, without reservations, questionings, or provisos. That decision covered all of his subsequent choices, and it was not a difficult decision for Caleb to make, because he knew that with God's presence, he could do mighty things (Joshua 14:12). Every year, I cover many thousands of miles in a preaching and teaching ministry that takes me to many countries around the globe, and people often ask me how I do it. My answer is the same one that Caleb gave: "If the Lord be with me, I will be able." In regard to an extensive ministry at my age, I have a prayer that I borrowed from three spiritual giants of the Old Testament; like Hezekiah, I pray for an extension of time (2 Kings 20:1-6); like Jabez, I pray for an enlargement of territory (1 Chronicles 4:10); and like Elisha, I pray for a greater endowment of power (2 Kings 2:9). When I was a teen preacher, people used to say to me, "You do pretty good for your age." Well, I want to keep going until they can say that again.




