## Horner's Corner

This is the last article I will write for *Connections* as the interim pastor of LBC. The time that Annie and I have been with you has been one of the most fulfilling periods in our lives, and we praise God for the opportunity to minister to you and give Him the glory for whatever may have been accomplished during that time. We have truly opened our hearts to you, and we feel the response of your genuine love. Perhaps in the providence of God that relationship will continue.

Speaking of those to whom he had ministered, the apostle John wrote, "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth" (3 John 3). I have failed to achieve what God has wanted me to do if you are not experiencing greater love for Him and for one another and if you have not grown "in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18). When you go out into the community, I would much rather that you brag about Jesus instead of the church or its pastor. Get excited about Jesus and exalt Him instead of promoting the church or the pastor, and perhaps the same thing will happen with LBC that happened with the church in Thessalonica: "For from you the word of the Lord has sounded forth . . . in every place. Your faith toward God has gone out, so that we do not need to say anything" (1 Thess. I:8).

In the first chapter of his letter to the believers in Thessalonica, Paul declares that they are God's church, and he states a threefold basis for his assertion. In doing so, he reveals some characteristics true of all genuine New Testament churches. Firstly, **the church lives in the world and "in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ"** (v. I). Every church has two habitats. It lives in the community where it is located and it lives in God, rooted in Him and deriving its life and power from Him.

Secondly, the church is marked by faith, hope and love (v. 3). It's apparent from the teaching of the New Testament, particularly in I Corinthians I3, that these three graces are indispensable characteristics of an authentic Christian life, and a church lacking them among its membership can hardly qualify as a New Testament church. These three virtues form a concise description of the individual Christian character and the corporate character of the church. Faith is a trustful commitment to God through Jesus Christ, beginning with the reception of what God has done for our salvation in Christ, and continuing in a daily dependence upon Him.

Love is continuing in a daily dependence upon Him. Love is the outstanding characteristic of the life and sacrifice of the Lord Jesus. Words cannot define it; Christ's example alone defines it. In response to His great love we love Him and we love one another. Hope in the New Testament sense is more than an optimistic outlook or wishful thinking or hoping for the best without any grounds. Hope in the New Testament is solid certainty, a look to the future that rests on the sure promises of God. So certain is our future as Christians, the Bible can speak of future events in the past tense. So every Christian without exception is a believer, a lover and a hoper. Faith, love and hope are resulting evidences of our regeneration by the Holy Spirit.

They re-orientate our whole life, so that we are drawn upwards to God in faith, outwards to other people in love, and onwards to second coming of Christ in hope.

But Paul does not present these three virtues as abstract concepts. Each one is productive, having concrete, practical results. Notice in verse 3 that Paul says that our faith in God leads to **good works**, without which faith is a barren claim. Faith is active as well as receptive; it gets busy; it does things; it works. The Christian is not one who is so heavenly minded that he is no earthly good. He doesn't walk around with his head so far in the clouds that his feet don't touch the ground.

Our love for people leads to **labor** on their behalf. If it doesn't, then it isn't real; it's mere sentiment or emotion. Jesus gave the command to love one another as He loves us, and then He illustrated what He meant by washing the feet of His disciples. True love sacrifices self in order to serve others, and it seeks the highest good of the other person even at personal expense.

Our hope in Christ leads to **endurance** or **steadfastness** as we wait for His coming. Hope for the Lord's return does not mean a quiet resignation, but active courage in the midst of hardships and difficulties. So according to 1 Thessalonians 1:3, the members of the church are marked by work produced by faith, labor prompted by love and endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Thirdly, the church gives visible evidence of transformed lives (vss. 3-7). Paul declares that he knows that the believers in Thessalonica belong to God because he could see the transformation of their lives when they received the gospel. The gospel came to them not in word only, but in power, and it bore fruit in their lives, in a work of faith, a labor of love, and an endurance of hope. It's only when people respond to the gospel and grow in holiness that their relationship to God becomes apparent and visible to others.

I want to emphasize to you that the main element in the church's identity is that it is the church of God. It is not a kind of religious club, united by a common interest. It is not a group that attaches itself to a human leader, united in their allegiance to him. It is God's church, a people chosen and loved by God in all eternity, rooted in God the Father and in the Lord Jesus Christ, drawing its life and power from Him. It is dreadfully wrong for the congregation to give, and for the pastor to expect, a devotion that is due to Christ alone. The one who matters is not the one who preaches, but the one who is preached. Losing sight of the absolute centrality of Jesus Christ can only result in tragic quarrels and divisions. One of the greatest needs of the Christian church today is that we give less glory to men and more glory to Christ.
