A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

The political conventions are over and the campaigns are in full swing. We have heard, and will continue to hear, much rhetoric and pomposity, charges and counter-charges, and denigrating mudslinging. In the midst of this muddle, our prayer should be that of the Psalmist: "Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you? Show us your mercy, Lord, and grant us your salvation" (Ps. 85:6-7). God had given Israel a great heritage and had poured blessing after blessing upon them, and they had prospered. But they became sleek and well fed and they forgot God. And God's judgment came.

America is a sick nation, because she has forgotten God. Despite the efforts of revisionists to rewrite history in order to omit the spiritual aspects of the founding of our country, the fact remains that America was built on certain basic Godgiven principles and presuppositions. The Pilgrim Fathers landed on these shores with a specific purpose. On November 11, 1620, before they touched dry land, they went into a cabin on a ship called the Mayflower, and they wrote a document known as The Mayflower Compact. The document begins with these very words: "In the name of God. Amen." Then the colonists state that the purpose of their coming was "for the glory of God and the advancement of the Christian faith."

In 1920 Roger Babson, a prominent American businessman published a book called Fundamentals of Prosperity. In the book he relates a conversation he had with the president of Argentina while on a visit to that country. They were discussing the difference between North America and South America. Why were the nations of South America so far behind America,

even though those nations had such rich natural resources? Here is the explanation that the Argentine President gave: "The difference is that those who settled South America came because they were seeking gold. Those who settled America came because they were seeking God."

What is the source of the revival for which we pray? Our hope is not in Washington; it is not in Wall Street; it is not with the political parties. Our hope is in God. Not only is God our hope; God is our biggest threat. We should not be as concerned about terrorism as we should be about the judgment of God if we do not repent. The problem in America is not just a pornographic Hollywood or polluted politicians or nonconstitutional judges. The problem is with God's people. Our churches are filled with spiritually apathetic weaklings who are more concerned with public opinion than they are with God's word. But God says that when we are humble and holv and repentant, then He will hear our plea for revival and will heal our land (2 Chron.

We need revival. If we can't have revival in the world, then let's have it in America. If we can't have revival in America, let's have it in the Chattahoochee Valley. If we can't have revival in the Chattahoochee Valley, let's have it in Lakewood Baptist. If we can't have revival in Lakewood Baptist, let's have it in the choir. If we can't have revival in the choir, let's have it in your family. If we can't have revival in your family, let's have it in you!

A Message from Andrew Spires

We have just returned from Romania on what was a very interesting and rewarding mission trip to the northern part of Romania to the town of Bistrita. We partnered with Golgotha Baptist Church and were blessed to have their students and young adults work alongside us as translators. We worked in two schools (aptly named schools #3 & #4) where we taught school of Heroes (VBS). We averaged between 100-200 students at both schools each day and we split our group into bible learning, crafts, and recreation/snacks. Everything ran very smoothly and our students and adults greatly enjoyed working with the children of Romania. We worked in these schools for a full week teaching about the heroes of the Bible such as Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, Hannah and Samuel, Jonah, and of course two days were spent on the greatest hero of them all, Jesus. The children were active and attentive despite the language barrier and on Friday we gave the students opportunity to make a decision for Christ. Between the two schools we had 64 professions of faith and an additional 20 students who asked for follow-ups with local pastors. Of course this was the overall goal of the trip and made all the preparation and planning worth it. At night, our group was split into three groups and many evenings were spent at local mission churches where we sang, gave our testimonies, and the Word was preached. We also got to spend time at a camp outside the city called Camp Hope where we did small jobs and cleanup and interacted with other local students and other missionaries. Another afternoon was spent at a disabled persons orphanage/daycare where some local Romanians have built a care center for those who need special assistance in life. The special needs folks were so sweet and had prepared crafts and also sang songs for our group, making it a great afternoon. The highlight of the week for our students was the time we spent with the students of Golgotha Baptist. We had planned to hold two days of student worship towards the end of the week with one night at Golgotha and one day at the camp. We gathered at the church on Friday night and ate pizza, and had a birthday party for one of the local pastors before going to worship. Once we entered the sanctuary I knew the night was going to be special, and indeed it was. We were led in worship by the Romanian students who sang songs we knew in English followed by several of our students who gave a very REAL testimony of their struggles in walking with God. The testimonies were given and God was at work, then followed the preaching of the Word. The Spirit of God fell in that place and lives were changed, walls came down, and sin was confessed, it was an amazing night for Americans and Romanians alike, and it is one I'll never forget. Overall, this trip had its challenges but we definitely enjoyed our time serving Romania and look forward to future service with our Romanian brothers and sisters. Thank you again to all who helped us get there, there will be people in heaven because of your faithfulness to advance the kingdom of God. I am happy to announce that I've already finalized next year's mission trip and we will join with two other churches (one from Columbus, and one in Tennessee) to return to our work in Belize with the goal of taking 100 Americans in June. Our dates are June 25th-July 1st, 2017, please begin praying and see if God is calling you to follow His command to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ around the world!
