A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

It was not by accident or incident that Jesus was born in Bethlehem. The place of His birth was engineered by God, as prophesied centuries before by the prophet Micah in Micah 5:2. The fact that there was no room for the Lord in Bethlehem foreshadows His rejection by a world that has no room for Him.

There is no room for Jesus in the world's government. "The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel against His Anointed, saying, 'Let us break Their bonds in pieces and cast away Their cords from us." Beginning with King Herod, who sought to kill Him, the world has rejected Jesus.

The Jews responded Pilate's question, "Shall I crucify your King?" with the declaration, "We have no king but Caesar." They had room for Caesar, but no room for Christ. It's the same today. Jews who immigrate to Israel receive automatic citizenship, except for Messianic Jews, those who believe that Jesus is the Messiah. An atheistic Jew, or a New Age Jew, or a

Jew who believes in almost anything except Jesus can receive automatic citizenship upon immigration to Israel.

Several years ago the United States Post Office designed a Christmas stamp that depicted a wreath in a window, with a candle in the wreath. Some official ordered the design to be changed, because he said the window pane behind the wreath resembled a cross. We have secularized our society to the point where not only is there neutrality, but antipathy toward the things of God.

There is no room for Jesus in the world's educational system. In a speech in 1948, General Omar Bradley spoke these words: "We have grasped the mystery of the atom and rejected the Sermon on the Mount. We're living in a time when our achievements, our knowledge of science, has gone far beyond our power to control it. We have many men of science, and too few men of God. We have achieved brilliance without wisdom, and power without conscience. Ours is a world of nuclear giants and spiritual infants."

In our public schools today, there is room for evolution, but not for creation; there is room for humanism, but not for the gospel; there is room for values clarification, but not for Bibles; there is room for revised history of our country, but not for our foundational Christian history; there is room for all kinds of clubs, but not for a Bible club; there is room for policemen in the halls, but not for the Ten Commandments on the classroom walls; there is

room for condoms, but not for Christ; there is room for discussion of abortion, homosexuality, and the occult, but not for biblical principles. As a result, in our public schools we are developing characters instead of developing character.

There is no room for Jesus in the world's religion. How many churches are so full of the world that they are allowing public opinion to dictate their doctrinal and moral teachings? How many are truly preaching the full deity of Jesus Christ, His virgin birth, and His blood atonement? How many are presenting a comfortable "gimme" gospel instead of one that demands repentance, holiness, and the Lordship of Christ? In Revelation 3:20, Jesus is speaking to the church that bears His name when He knocks on the door and asks to be let in.

In large measure, there is no room for Jesus in the Christmas season. Instead of honoring the King of kings and the Lord of lords, multitudes of people use Christmas as an excuse for drunkenness, adultery, and gluttony. Their heroes of Christmas are Tiny Tim, Rudolph, and a jolly red-faced, rotund man with whiskers. In preparation for Christmas recently, the management of a large mall in Florida sent out a notice that choirs and other singing groups that perform there could not sing any songs that mention Jesus. Frosty and Rudolph are acceptable, but not Jesus or the three kings of the Orient. Santa Claus is coming to town, but all ye faithful won't be coming. Grandma might get run over by a reindeer, but it won't be on O Holy Night, and mommy might kiss Santa Claus, but it won't be on Silent Night. You might be home for Christmas and rock around the Christmas tree, but you won't hear the herald angels sing. It might begin to look a lot like a Christmas that's holly jolly, and you might be dreaming of a white Christmas as you let it snow in a winter wonderland, but it won't be in the little town of Bethlehem. You can deck the halls and jingle silver bells on a sleigh ride, but you won't hear the angels sing about joy to the world. With all that, there may be a happy holiday, even if there isn't a merry Christmas.

One day there will be plenty of room for Jesus and for all who follow Him, when "the kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of our Lord" (Rev. 11:15). As the old spiritual says, "Plenty good room in my Father's Kingdom. Choose your seat and sit down."

We've reached the final month of the year and it has been a great one! I can't remember a year that went by so quickly yet was full of so many fulfilling opportunities to serve. As we finish the year we look back and reflect on the challenges. opportunities, and blessings. Looking back we have accomplished our goals of service; we have served locally with the homeless, in the LBC VBS, our canned food drive, and VRM toy giveaway, we have served stateside as we worked in the inner city of New Orleans this summer at Mission Lab, and we served in the foreign mission field in both Belize and Romania. Everything we do in the student and young adult ministries is centered around these three goals of service. Even our fundraising is centered around affording students the opportunity to be used by God as salt and light. As we look forward to 2017 we already have much planned. Next summer we will travel to the city of Boston in cooperation with Morningside Baptist of Columbus and NAMB to work in a stateside mission field that is truly desperate for the Gospel. We will be challenged in new ways to assist new church plants who don't have the luxuries of their own church buildings, large budgets, talented musicians, or even sound equipment. It is hard to believe that in a major metropolitan area in the United States of America that so few people attend church because there are so few churches! It's one thing to go to a foreign country and establish a new work among an indigenous people who haven't historically heard the Gospel message but you wouldn't think that

there would be so many unreached people in New England! We look forward to this new challenge but also to the familiar challenge of Belize in 2017. Our Belize mission trips through International Servants have continued to grow and bear much fruit. The work there is endless but each time we go back we see stronger churches, new construction, new farms, and new believers in the faith. In 2017 we will are thrilled to be joined by Calvary & Bethesda Baptist from Columbus along with First Baptist of Dickson, Tennessee. We hope to be able to run simultaneous VBS programs in two locations along with multiple construction, medical, and dental teams. This will be the largest coordinated effort for me to organize in more than 15 years of Belize missions. This trip is still open and it's not too late for you to find your place of ministry with us. Finally, we need your help with our largest fundraiser of the year, the Christmas tree sale for missions. Please help spread the word about our tree lot as we'll have 200 trees set up in the side parking lot this Christmas. Hours of operation are as follows: Mon-Fri: 12pm-9pm, Sat: 9am-10pm, **Sunday 1pm-9pm**. If you preordered a tree you can pick it up any time after 2pm on Saturday, November 26th through Saturday, December 17th (unless we sell out before then). Thank you for your continued support and prayers, join us in praying for God's will to be done in and through us, and that we will reach the lost with the life changing truth of the Gospel in 2017.


