A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

I just read about another megachurch that announced its acceptance and support of same-gender marriage and the right of the LGBT community to hold offices in the church, including the ministerial staff and Bible teachers. In his sermon announcing the policy, the pastor stated that the Bible teaches that we are to love and accept everyone, and that people have the right to marry whomever they choose. I'll have to admit that Satan is good at his job of deceiving churches into allowing public opinion to determine their view of doctrine and morality, rather than the Word of God. This trend should not surprise us, because it's a fulfillment of prophecy as we enter the last days.

The article reminded me of Peter's declaration that judgment begins at the house of God (1 Pet. 4:17), and I found a great example of that kind of judgment in the Book of Ezekiel. Israel was in captivity in Babylon, and God revealed to the prophet why He had brought judgment upon the people by allowing the captivity. In chapter 8 of the book, God took Ezekiel back in time and showed him through a hole in the wall all the abominations going on in Jerusalem, and particularly in the Temple. Then in chapter 9 God gave Ezekiel a vision of six men, one of whom had a writer's inkhorn by his side, and the others armed with weapons. The man with the inkhorn went through the city and put a mark on the forehead of everyone who was burdened by the sins of the people and were crying out to God. The ones with weapons went out after him and killed all those who did not have the mark. God gave the executioners the command, "Begin at My sanctuary" (v. 9). So judgment began at the house of God. Our country today is filled with evil every bit as vile as that described in Ezekiel, and we don't have to look through a hole in the wall to see the filth and corruption.

The man with the writer's inkhorn marked all who were grieving over the sins of the people, and all who were unconcerned were slain. If God followed that same procedure in America today, we would see the most devastating massacre in history, because many pastors and multitudes of professing Christians are either flowing in the tide of public depravity or showing indifference to it. "The time has come for judgment to begin at the house of God," wrote Peter. Too many sermons are bedtime stories that lull the people to sleep instead of morning reveilles to wake them up. God will not withhold His judgment, and He will reveal the true colors of compromising pastors and the mass of nominal churchgoers who honor God with their lips while their hearts are far from Him. Much of the blame for the national depravity and spirit of hatred and violence lies at the door of the church. Our indifference, our neglect, and our failure to cry out against iniquity have encouraged more of the same ungodly atmosphere. Unfaithful preachers, unbiblical theology and morality, and unholy living have disgraced the house of God until He must first cleanse the temple, as Jesus did long ago. God's house has become a den of thieves, and it's time for a whip of judgment.

We are in the last days, and God is sifting His people. Even now there is a beginning of separation between the large crowd of Sunday-morning church attenders and the smaller group that really mean business with God. On the one hand, there are the compromisers who trim their sail to catch the breeze of society's breath. They will end up in one great apostate aggregation in league with the world, the flesh, and the devil. On the other hand, there is the faithful remnant who set their sail to catch the wind of the Holy Spirit and who stay the course through the storms. The word of Joshua to "sanctify yourselves for tomorrow" (Josh. 3:5; 7:13) is timely right now. I beseech everyone who claims the name of Christ, reconfirm your commitment to Him, get your priorities in order, get back to the Book, and watch unto prayer.

This month, I'd like to share with you a letter I received from Ashley Woodburn, one of our student leaders, who's a senior at Glenwood. As many of you know, Lisa Woodburn (Ashley's mother), has had some serious health problems over the last couple of years which are detailed in the letter, those health issues weighed heavily on the family, and especially Ashley. We all face troubles, hardships, and trials in this life, the only question is how we respond? The letter from Ashley speaks to her physical and spiritual journey through this trial, and I know it will be meaningful to you, as it was to me.

Lost and Found

I have always grown up in church and have come to know the Lord as my Savior and friend. I have always heard people talk about how they have become blind to His path and I could never understand why people, who love God, just forget Him in an instant. Jeremiah 29:11 states, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." I have trusted His plan for my life, but seeing my mom lie in pain made me not want Him anymore. January 27, 2015 is the day my life fell apart and I was lost.

My mom and I had just started working out at Anytime Fitness with a trainer. We were in the middle of a workout and my mom felt lightheaded and sick. The trainer instructed her to lie down on the couch, but things just became worse. By the time we got home, my mom could barely walk. I called my dad to come help her out of the car. After she was settled, I went to my room to do my homework. One hour had passed and my dad called me downstairs to tell me that my Grammy was coming to watch me because he was taking my mom to the emergency room. When those words came out of my dad's mouth, I knew something was wrong. Around twelve o'clock at night, my dad called to tell us they were rushing mom to Birmingham for monitoring because they found something wrong. He came back home and drove us to Birmingham. When we got to Birmingham, the doctor let us know that my mom had an AVM, or a brain bleed, and they sent her to ICU. I stayed in the waiting room that whole weekend being comforted by family and friends, but I was hurting inside and I did not want their comfort. I just wanted my mom to be okay. Saturday night my mom had a seizure, and I thought I was slowly losing my mom to this thing inside of her. On Sunday, my dad decided that it was best for me to go home so I would not miss school. I did not want to leave my mom because I thought that could be the last day I would see her alive. Thankfully, the doctors sent her home and she would return back in a few months for radiation. I was slowly slipping away from God and my old life I knew.

My mom had her radiation and things were looking up for her. On August 30, 2016, my mom received the news that the radiation had killed the "tumor" but it was expanding. The doctors planned to perform a craniotomy on my mom to completely remove the "tumor". All I knew was that I was done with God and this life that I once knew. I tried to pray and stick with it, but I felt that it was all a joke. Nothing seemed to help the situation. How could He let there be a "part two" to my mom's situation? I dreaded going to church and I wanted to resign from the youth leadership team. I became unhappy and did not want to participate in any church events. The devil was testing and he was winning.

On October 17, 2016, my mom was sent into surgery. My dad, Grammy, and I were left in the waiting room for eight hours. It was crowded, cold, and I worried the whole time about what was happening to my mom. I checked the progress board every thirty minutes to see if my mom was out of surgery. I roamed the hospital to make time go by faster. The chaplin came by about three hours into the surgery and prayed for us, but I did not want his prayer. After mom's surgery, I finally got the chance to see her. When I entered the room, my heart broke. I saw my mom lying in pain with many wires and tubes coming out of her and her head wrapped up in a ton of bandages. My dad and youth pastor were both motioning me to come to her bedside, but I did not want to go. I did not want to go because I was afraid if I touched her I would cause more pain. I became overwhelmed with emotions and I ran out of her room. I ran all the way to the bathroom. I had no comfort in the bathroom. It was just me alone in silence because I had rejected the last hope of God. After crying for ten minutes in the bathroom, I decided to just sit in the waiting room in my own thoughts. When I came out of the bathroom, I saw my youth pastor standing by a table with a metal tree. I did not notice that tree before when I came to the waiting room. When I reached the tree, I realized this tree was filled with prayers. The prayers were written by family members and friends asking for healing for their relatives in the hospital. Under the tree were cards with bible verses on them. When I looked up at my youth pastor, he was handing me one of the verses, and told me I needed to read it. In my mind, I rolled my eyes and said I do not need this. I read the verse, but I do not remember what it said. I always go back to the thought of how I could not stop looking at that tree, and I think now that that tree was God's call to say I'm still here.

After reading all the prayers on that tree, I realized that God had not given up on my prayers and my mom. At that moment in time, I realized that my mom was going to be okay because she was in the hands of God. I also realized the devil had tested me this whole time, and I knew I could not let the devil win any longer. I dried my tears and went back to my mom's room and stayed with her until I had to leave. Every bad emotion had left my body, and I knew God never stopped loving me. Ever since that day, my relationship with God has never been closer, and my mom is just fine now. I never thought the worst part of my life would bring the best spiritual experience of my life.
