The war rages on!

We might be tempted to think that it is harder to be a Christian today than it ever has been. There are many contributing factors that lead to this thought; the ease of access to sin, the secular society of our time, the degeneration of the traditional family unit, and the hyperbusyness of everyone's schedule, just to name a few. While all of these factors are true and apparent, our enemies are actually still the same as they have always been. I think we can separate our adversaries into three usual suspects; 1.) worldliness, 2.) ourselves (our sinful nature), and 3.) the enemy (devil). Let's break down each of our enemies.

Worldliness; Romans 12:2 says; "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—His good, pleasing and perfect will." The world is always imparting its values upon us. These "values" are most often taught through media sources (social media, TV, streaming apps). We are constantly bombarded with shows and advertisements that quietly and deceptively lure us into a worldly mindset. We can also be enticed by conversation and comparison with other people. Seeing what other people have and hearing what other people treasure can be detrimental, to say the least. If we are not careful, we can easily be lulled into chasing after the things of this world. Chasing success and possessions are enticements that have always been problematic for those who are seeking to follow the Lord because they deflect our focus from the eternal to the temporal.

Ourselves; James 1:13-15 says; 13 "When tempted, no one should say, "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor

does He tempt anyone; 14 but each person is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evil desire and enticed. 15 Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death." Everyone who has been a believer for any length of time should know that this is true. The simple truth is, we don't need much enticement to sin. As long as we live in this body (flesh) we will battle our sin nature. Even as Christians, we can be tempted to take advantage of God's grace and merciful forgiveness by continuing in sin. Many believers are mired in secret sins that master them and they cannot seem to break free. Yet, the bible is full of commands and reminders about fighting for holiness and purity. Yes, every sin is forgiven, and covered by the blood of the Lamb, but we must get into the fight for personal holiness. We do this through prayer, seeking accountability, and through the power of the Holy Spirit. We fight temptation and sin one thought, and one action at a time. Fight this way and you'll experience more victories than losses.

The enemy; Ephesians 6:10-13 says; 10 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. 11 Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. 12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. 13 Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand." Adam and Eve didn't notice the craftiness of the enemy until it was too late. The devil got them to question God's Word, doubt God's goodness, and believe his lies. The formula is still the same, but the cure is sure.





However, I am resolved not to grieve because my time with you is over, but to rejoice and praise God for the opportunity that Annie and I had to have been with you for so long. No distance of place or lapse of time can weaken the strength of the bond of fellowship that we knew. Actually it's the blessings that we have received from that fellowship that makes saying goodbye so difficult. God brought us together at a crucial point in the life of Lakewood, and we experienced together the wonder of His power to heal and restore. I have been in Christian ministry for almost 70 years, and the brief period in which I served as your interim pastor was the most enjoyable time of that ministry.

From the very beginning of our association, you have been a vital part of my extended ministry. The apostle Paul thanked God for the partnership in the gospel that he experienced with the church at Philippi (Phil. 1:5), and I have the same gratitude toward you. As you know, I have spent a great deal of time preaching and teaching the gospel around the globe. Your support helped make it possible. 
