

After forty years of wandering around in the desert, the Hebrews were getting ready to cross over the Jordan River into the land that God had promised them. By way of preparation, their leaders gave them certain instructions, found in Joshua 3:1-5. They were to keep the Ark of the Covenant far enough in front of the mass of people in order that everyone could see it, and when it moved they were to follow it. Verse 4 gives the reason: "That you may know the way by which you must go, for you have not passed this way before." We can certainly say the same thing about the new year that we are facing. We have not been this way before, and we don't know what this year may bring. The key to this passage is the Ark of the Covenant, which was a picture of the Lord Jesus Christ and represented God's presence with the people. The Ark had been in their possession for forty years, and they had been carrying it around with them in their midst, but now there was a dramatic change in the position of the Ark. Now the Ark would not be in their midst, but in front of them, leading them.

Why are some Christians victorious and other Christians not victorious? All Christians possess Jesus, but the difference is not in possession; it's in position. All Christians have the Lord Jesus Christ, but not every Christian follows the Lord Jesus Christ into victory. You see, when the Ark that they possess becomes the head and the leader, when the Lord becomes the leader, when the resident becomes the president, when the Christ who abides comes to preside, then there is victory. Victory is seeing which way God is going and then following Him. The people of Israel were told that when they saw the ark move, they were to go after it. And that made the difference between forty years of wandering in the wilderness and crossing over into the land of promise. If your New Year's resolution is not to take a step without your eyes on the Ark and to go wherever the ark goes, I can give you the same promise that Joshua gave in verse 5: "The Lord will do wonders among you."

A new year is an adventure. Just as Israel had never been this way before, we will be walking through unexplored territory, not knowing what the future holds. But you don't have to know where; you don't have to know when; you don't have to know why. If you are following the Ark, God will guide you through uncharted places, He will grant you unfading promises, and He will guard you with unfailing power.
