MESSAGE FROM BROTHER M.R.

This month has been a time of great blessings. A time for rejoicing and thanksgiving in my life, and the life of my family. Therefore, I have spent a great deal of time trying to discover the words to express my great joy, and to thank God for all the ways he shows His love for me.

Many times I fall back on the Bible, and the celebrations of the saints before me who also discovered the joy of being in the middle of God's plan for their lives. I look for words like Joy, Delight and Praise as these are the reality of a heart that has found freedom in obedience to the Word of God. That very truth sounds like a contradiction, but nothing could be further from the truth. God proclaims that truth in Galatians 5:1 when He says "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm then and do not let yourselves be burdened again with the yoke of slavery". What God is trying to get us to realize is that we really aren't free because we can do as we wish. No, true freedom is only found when we are free to do what is right. Christ died to set us free from the slavery of sin. To enable us to live outside of the control of the sinful nature and actually live the life God had planned for us. To actually offer up our bodies as living sacrifices Holy and pleasing to God, as we are commanded in Romans 12:1. Now I realize to many this might feel like a great sacrifice, and even a loss of freedom in the present world in which we live but it is not. Sin is not a reward, nor is it the source of true joy, nor contentment. Sin is a trap! A means by which our enemy gains his advantage with the hopes of making us His slave. God and the Devil are not alike, they are opposites. God gives freedom to all who dare to believe him and take Him at his word. God did not create mankind to be enslaved. One of the most interesting facts of the creation story is found in the first thing God said to man. The first thing God commanded Adam to do was to be free and to not sacrifice that freedom for the slavery of sin. (Genesis 2:15-17) "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden". "You are free" were God's first words to man! However God did not stop there, he went on to give Adam a plan that would protect him from the Devil's plan to enslave him. You must not eat from one tree. Now did God give him those instructions to make Adam his slave, or was it given to protect him and keep him free? It was given to protect him and allow him to remain free. The direct application of God's Word to his life would have set him free from the plans of the enemy to harm him. Well, we all know the rest of the story. Adam and Eve both took a worldly view of God's Word and felt that they were missing out on something the world had to offer, and their freedom was lost. Satan had convinced them that sin offered true freedom, not obedience.

I know that I have felt that same way myself. I have often looked at the scriptures and felt that obedience would be a sacrifice. Only to find that I was yet foolish, and that had I done things God's way, it would have brought about those dreams that are now lost. Obedience to God's Word will set us free from the plans of the enemy. And when we break free from His plans we will live and experience the life more abundant and free that Jesus promised us. God's plans for us are good! God set forth His plans for us in Jeremiah 29:11 where He said "I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord. Plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future". What exactly is the hope that God has planned for us? It is the hope that we will all one day see Jesus face to face. That we will in the end finish the race laid out for us before the beginning of time. It is that we might take hold of the hope we have in this world that we are not alone. It is the hope of the second coming and the truth that one day all the tears will be washed away. It is the hope that comes from the realization that God is good all the time and we can trust him with the everyday things that concern us and enjoy the life we have here, and know our life in the hereafter is safe and secure as well.

In Hebrews 6:17-20 God paints a beautiful picture of just why we can have such hope. It begins by saying "Because God wanted to make His purpose very clear", now what exactly is God's purpose? Why did he give us his word in the first place? That we might not have to live without this great hope. Romans 15:4 reads "For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope." God's Word is not here to limit our freedom but is in

fact here to encourage us to take hold of the freedom offered by God that we might escape the slavery of sin set before us by the enemy.

The picture God set before us of how this has been done, is really quite beautiful. The image is that of the forerunner, who went out before the ship when it could not enter a port because of the wind. The forerunner would row a small boat into the safety of the port, and there tie off the ship to an anchor. To this very day if you visit the old ports you can still see the anchor that was bored into the solid rock to be used by the forerunners. Once this rope was secure, the ship could be pulled inch by inch into the safety of the port. Faith hope and love but the greatest of these is love. With this picture in mind listen to the words from Heb.6: 19-20 once again. "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure. It enters the inner sanctuary behind the curtain where Jesus has gone before us, and has entered on our behalf". Jesus has entered heaven on our behalf and has anchored our souls there as day by day he draws us nearer to our final destination where He is. This is the hope that encourages us to get back up and try again. This is the hope that drives us to dare to believe, and take God at His Word. This is the hope that gives us peace in the midst of the storm. Knowing that no storm can break the cord of love that holds us secure. This is the hope that leads us to say If God is for us, who can be against us. "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ Jesus" (Romans 8:35).

Silence is the answer to that question, for nothing in our past or our present, nothing in heaven nor on earth, no nothing can separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus. Oh what a gift we have in the Bible, because with it we can stand the test of the enemy, and discover the reality of true freedom. God's Word applied directly to our lives is the answer to all of life's struggles. Not only that, it is the best way I know to avoid a lot of the worlds problems in the first place!

San Roman is a large school with over 800 students where we served last year while San Juan is a smaller school of 150. We will be splitting our time between these two villages and it is our prayer that God will lead some of these children into relationship with Him while we are there. Please be in prayer for both these villages in the following areas; San Roman- the Jehovah's Witnesses have developed a strong presence there including recently building a grass roof Kingdom Hall near the school, pray that we can display the TRUTH of gospel effectively to combat false teaching. San Juan- is a much smaller, more impoverished area where International Servants house one of their Feed-A-Child centers, they have not had a mission team in about five years, please pray that God would use the food we serve them to open the doors of their hearts to receive the gospel message. Your prayers are essential as we go on this trip, please intercede for us daily as we serve.

All projects will be scheduled promptly and done at no cost. The church body is so often a blessing to the student ministry, we want to use the abilities we have to be a blessing in return.
