A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

Someone said to me a few days ago, "I want to serve the Lord, but I'm so inadequate and unqualified, there's nothing I can do." That's a false statement, because the Bible teaches us that we possess whatever is necessary to do what God calls us to do; otherwise, God would not ask us to do it. We just need to use the ability God has given us. The devil knows that he can't take away that which God has given us, so he tries to keep us from using it. If the devil can keep us from doing what God has commanded us to do, through fear, discouragement, self-pity, or any other means, then he has been successful.

There was a boy in Germany who was labeled "a slow learner." His teacher recommended that he be withdrawn from school because he would never amount to anything. He tried to go to school in Switzerland, but he falled the entrance exam. He was fired from three teaching jobs, but at the age of 26 he won the Nobel Prize for physics. By the way, the boy's name was Albert Einstein. He is only one example of people who used what they had and achieved great things. How much more important is it for children of God to use the ability God has given them?

Many people feel that what they have is **Insignificant**. Let me tell you how God took something insignificant from a man's hand and used it to accomplish miraculous deeds. In Exodus 4:2 the Lord asked Moses what he had in his hand. Moses responded that it was only a stick that he used in herding his sheep. As far as he was concerned, the stick had no use or value otherwise. But God said, "Give it to me," and in His hands, that stick became an instrument for the working of miracles (see Exod. 4:5; 14:16; 17:5-6, 8-11).

The devil may tell you that the thing that you have in your life—time, talent, treasure—is insignificant, and it is insignificant as long as you try to use it in your own strength or hide it away. But give God that which seems to be insignificant, and He will use it in a significant way.

Some people do not serve God because they think that what they have is **Insufficient**. They don't have enough time or energy or talent. The widow apologized to the prophet Elijah for her meager amount of food, but when she gave it to God, it kept multiplying (1 Kings 17:12-16). If she had hoarded what little she had instead of giving it to God, they would have starved. But when she gave it to God, He multiplied it over and over. People who hoard their time and energies and abilities will starve spiritually, but those who let God multiply what they give to Him will be spiritually full and running over.

Some people do not serve God because they think that what they have is **Inane** and will invite the ridicule and laughter of the world. When David went out to do battle against Goliath with only a sling and stones, the giant laughed at him. But when the giant fell with a stone in his forehead, no one was laughing any more, and a great victory was won. People may laugh at what God has given you. They may tell you that it's impossible for you to do anything for God. But remember David and give God what little you have, and He will use it to defeat some great giants.

Some people do not serve God because they think they are **Inadequate** because of a handicap or old age or some other reason. Moses argued that he was 80 years old and that he had a stammering tongue that kept him from being an eloquent speaker. But when he gave to God a staff that he used to control the sheep, God enabled him to use it to lead the Hebrews to the Promised Land.

What do you have in your hand? Does it seem insignificant? God wants to use small things. Does it seem insufficient? Little is much when God is in it. Does the world laugh at what God has given you? Like David's slingshot, it can defeat giants. Do you allow your age or frailty or former failure keep you from doing what God wants you to do? God can use an old stick in the hands of a stammering old man to demonstrate His power. It really isn't what's in your hand that matters. It's what you let God do with it.



What does it mean to give to the Circles of Influence?

Just as a pebble in a pond makes waves far from where they began, a dollar into the Circles of Influence fund touches ministries in our local area, North America and the uttermost parts of the earth.



The scripture basis is II Corinthians 9:5 "I thought it necessary to urge the brothers to visit you in advance and finish the arrangements for the generous gift you had promised. Then it will be ready as a generous gift, not as one grudgingly given."

It's like a Christmas Club for missions. EACH TIME YOU GIVE YOUR REGULAR TITHES AND OFFERINGS, YOU DESIGNATE AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT TO CIRCLES OF INFLUENCE...but rather than waiting for the end of the year to disperse the funds, checks are written monthly to each of these ministries.

Imagine if 150 families gave \$30.00 a month, \$1 a day, for just for 11 months a year to Circles of Influence. That could easily reach \$49,500.00 a year combined! Here's what each ministry could receive versus what they received our last fiscal year.
