

A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

As I write these words, I am on the island of Borneo, the third largest island in the world, with some of the most primitive territory on earth, most noted for its exotic species of plant and animal life. I am in a place called Kota Marudu. I'm fairly certain that few people in America have ever heard of it, but I'm also certain that there are people here who know more about what's going on in the USA than the citizens of the USA know. That statement is certainly true of Christians in Borneo who are concerned about the spiritual condition of our country. Not only here, but everywhere else I travel, people ask about political and spiritual issues in America, because they are bewildered by the fact that our nation has drifted so far from biblical principles, and apparently the churches of America are silently accepting the changes. People of other countries have always looked to the USA as the leader and strength of the world in every area, politically, spiritually, morally, and economically. Their newspapers and televisions keep them well informed of what's happening in America, and they don't understand, particularly Christians, how a country that has been so favored by God and that has always been an unapologetic champion and defender of biblical principles now seems hell bent to move in the opposite direction. Those who live under Muslim rule are amazed that our government is deaf and blind to Muslim aspirations to dominate the world, and will use whatever means necessary to achieve their goals. Meanwhile, it's business as usual in the church today. As American society races toward hell and judgment, the church can't get people to be serious about prayer, Bible study, or evangelism. Think of the things that bother us enough to yell and talk back to the television, but don't bother us enough to get on our faces before God. We have allowed public opinion to determine our moral values instead of the Word of God, and as a result. we have:

- The Supreme Court approving same sex marriage.
- Entertainers, businesses, sports organizations, and other enterprises boycotting states that enact laws protecting children from perverts.
- The teaching of a homosexual agenda to our school children, beginning in kindergarten.
- Indescribable filth on the internet.
- Church splits, denominational politics, and power struggles because of moral compromise.
- Believers arguing about political correctness instead of uniting to resist the world, the flesh, and the devil.
- The popularity of a watered down, secular, man-centered gospel that allows people to be comfortable in their sins rather than warning them of God's judgment.
- The lack of a noticeable difference between the average Christian and a person of the world.
- A government that wants to support idlers at the expense of the workers.
- Liars by the scores in Washington, D.C. who change their stories every hour.

other, deep within the mysterious sea. As the kids submerge themselves in God's Word, they will discover that Jesus didn't just see what's on the outside of people. He looked deep down on


